- 6) Churches, care for one another through phone calls, texts and emails. Keep up the Christian fellowship, even at a distance. (**John 15:13**)
- 7) Church leaders, this is the time to lead, but do so calmly! Identify and try new ways of church ministry to include electronic worship and online giving. (**Revelation 21:5**)
- 8) Church, be the Church of Acts 2 where they made sure that no one had any needs. This is the time to give, not hide. (Acts 2:42-47)




## SENIOR ADULT MISSION TRIP TO LYNCH,
