Kershaw Baptist Association CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS AND RULES OF ORDER

CONSTITUTION

Preamble: We, the messengers of the Kershaw Baptist Association, from the churches of the Southern Baptist Convention of Kershaw County, South Carolina, and adjacent areas, do hereby agree to certain fundamental principles, which amended from time to time are as follows:

ARTICLE I – NAME

This body shall be known as "The Kershaw Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION

- A. Membership in this body shall be confined to churches which conform to the New Testament doctrines of faith and practice as described in the Baptist Faith and Message (2000) and which cooperate with and financially support the association, the South Carolina Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.
- B. This Association shall be composed of messengers chosen by each church cooperating with the Association. Each church shall be entitled to two messengers and to one additional messenger for each fifty members or fraction thereof with a maximum representation of fifteen (15) messengers from any one church. (Director of Missions and officers do not count against the quota of the churches of which they are members.) The DOM and officers referred to in Article V shall be messengers by virtue of the office held.
- C. Churches desiring to affiliate with the Kershaw Baptist Association shall submit a written request for membership to the Missions Committee as least thirty (30) days before a biannual Executive Meeting. The Missions Committee shall make a thorough investigation of the petitioning church as to its doctrine, practices, and support of the total program of work and shall report on the petition at the biannual session of the Association, recommending one of the following courses of action:
 - 1. Acceptance of the church into the Kershaw Baptist Association
 - 2. Rejection of the petition or
 - 3. Watchcare, to allow for additional study

The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee. Unless the Missions Committee recommends that a church's request be rejected, all petitioning churches will be received under watchcare for their first year. Watchcare will be under

supervision of the Missions Committee.

- D. Watchcare churches will:
 - 1. Provide a copy of the Constitution and By-laws, current leadership roster and document of incorporation by the state, if incorporated.
 - 2. Complete and return the Annual Church Profile.
 - 3. Begin or continue missions giving through the Association.
 - 4. Fulfill any additional prerequisites specified by the Missions Team.

When churches have fulfilled the responsibilities of their watchcare year, the Missions Committee will recommend that their watchcare period be approved as completed. Such approval will normally come in the Biannual Meeting the year after the watchcare begins. Should any of the above responsibilities lack completion or any significant issue need resolution, the recommendation to prolong the watchcare status will be brought to the Executive Committee.

- E. Waiving the Watchcare. The watchcare year may be waived for a church which is transferring from another association. This church must come from a neighboring association and be transferring with a good report from that association. They also must fulfill the four obligations listed above. The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee.
- F. Withdrawal of member churches from the Kershaw Baptist Association may be accomplished by written statement to the association.
- G. Dismissal of a church may be recommended by the Missions Committee for those who are not conforming to section A or who does not turn in their ACP Report for a period of three (3) consecutive years. This motion would be brought up at an Executive Committee for discussion and vote and if the motion is approved for dismissal, then the church would be brought to a vote for dismissal at a biannual meeting with no discussion. The Missions team will work with the church to see that they are brought into a proper relationship with the Association before any action is taken.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purpose of the Kershaw Baptist Association is to serve its member churches. The Association is a family of autonomous churches in a voluntary partnership, uniquely joined together to follow God's leadership for carrying out the full scope of the Great Commission. The Association shall endeavor to: build fellowship among the churches thus resulting in

teamwork and unity; provide leadership development opportunities which will enable the churches and their staff to be effective in their ministry; help churches discover immediate needs within their community and determine how

those needs can be met; engage in cooperative mission efforts which exceed the capabilities of any one church alone: discover, enlist, and deploy volunteers in mission service at home and abroad; serve as an information and resource network; promote the work of the kingdom throughout the world in cooperation with other Baptist agencies.

ARTICLE IV - REPORTS FROM THE CHURCHES

The churches are expected to submit their Annual Church Profile to the Kershaw Baptist Association before the Fall Meeting, see Article 2 section G.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Finance Committee Chairperson, Personnel Committee Chairperson, Missions Committee Chairperson, Historian, Parliamentarian, three Trustees, WMU Director, and other ministry leaders as needed. They shall be elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting of the Association. The Nominating Committee shall present a nominee for each office. Other nominations are in order from the floor. These officers shall be elected by majority vote of those present and voting. Their term of office shall

be one-year beginning upon their election at the July Executive Committee Meeting. The Moderator may not be elected to more than two consecutive terms. The Trustees shall serve terms of three years unless otherwise specified at the time of their election. No Trustee shall be eligible to succeed himself until one year has elapsed. All officers shall be members of churches cooperating with the Association. Officers may be removed by a 2/3 vote at any Executive Committee or Bi-Annual Meeting for cause.

ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

The duties of Associational officers shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Association, Director of Missions, pastors of cooperating churches, and two additional members elected by each church. The officers of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee shall transact the business of the association during the interim between annual meetings. It shall meet two times annually, once in January and once in July, as set forth in the Calendar of Activities or by call of the Moderator if found necessary. The members present shall constitute a quorum, with notice having been given of the meeting. The Committee shall report its actions to the Fall Meeting of the Association by the minutes of the Clerk. The moderator may call special meetings of the Executive Committee as he may deem necessary, with written notice being sent to members ten days prior to the meeting and such notices informing members of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

The Association shall have the Standing committees listed below along with any other committee authorized by the Association and each member will serve a three year term except the Nominating Committee as it is a one year term. The Director of Missions and Moderator will serve as ex-officio members of all Associational Committees.

- A. Nominating Committee
- B. Program Committee
- C. Finance Committee
- D. Constitution and Bylaws Committee
- E. Missions Committee
- F. Enrollment Committee
- G. Personnel Committee
- H. Christian/Life Committee
- I. Ordination Committee

ARTICLE IX - ADMINISTRATION

The Director of Missions and other employees of the Association shall be charged with responsibility of the promotion of the whole program of the Association and Denomination. They shall work under the direction of and in cooperation with the Personnel Committee. They shall be nominated by the Personnel Committee of the Association, and elected by the Association at any Biannual Session, or by the Executive Committee if the next Biannual Session of the Association is thirty (30) days or more beyond the date on which the employees are nominated.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

BYLAWS

The work of the Association shall be governed by the following Bylaws.

ARTICLE I - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section A. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the Bi-Annual and Executive Committee Meetings. This person shall see that order and decorum are observed by all messengers.

Section B. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Moderator to preside in the absence, or upon the request of the Moderator. This officer shall assist the Moderator in the carrying out of his duties to the best interest of the Association. The Vice-Moderator shall accede to the office of Moderator should that office become vacant.

Section C. The clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, publish and distribute the Annual Minutes, and perform such other duties as the interest of the Association may require. Further, the clerk shall keep the minutes of the Executive Committee meetings and report same to the Biannual Meeting of the Association. For this service, the clerk shall receive all necessary expenses and remuneration as stipulated in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section D. The Treasurer shall be responsible for presenting the financial report of the Association to the executive committee and at the annual and bi-annual associational meetings. The Treasurer serves as ex-officio member of the Finance Committee. The treasurer cannot be an employee of the association.

Section E. The Historian shall record important things that happen during the year. The historian shall also keep on file articles and items of interest relating to the churches of the Association. The Historian shall be reimbursed for all expenses incurred in the execution of his duties as provided for in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section F. The Parliamentarian is an advisor to the Moderator and shall, upon the Moderator's request, render to the Moderator and/or Association whatever service is needed.

Section G. There shall be three trustees who shall hold title to all property of the Association, whether real or otherwise, and shall execute such transfers of title, or signature, only as authorized by the Association. They shall be responsible for the upkeep of Associational property.

Section H. All other ministry leaders shall promote and supervise their programs in the Association in cooperation with the administrative staff.

ARTICLE II - COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

The Moderator and Director of Missions at the Spring Meeting shall appoint five persons to comprise the Nominating Committee to report at the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all Kershaw Baptist Association officers, committees, and ministry leaders. Nominations

from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the elected leaders serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Nominations for vacancies

occurring between business sessions may be presented at any Biannual or Executive Committee for election.

Section A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE, consisting of five (5) persons appointed by the Moderator and Director of Missions, shall report to the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all associational officers, ministry leaders, and other committees. Nominations from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the Committee members serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Persons to fill vacancies occurring between business sessions may be presented for election by the Executive Committee.

Section B. PROGRAM COMMITTEE, consisting of six (6) members (Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Associational Music Director and three members selected by the nominating committee), shall prepare the Program for the Biannual Sessions. The suggested program shall

be presented in printed form to the Association at the beginning of the session for action. They shall recommend to the Association at the Bi-Annual Meeting: the time, place, speaker, and alternate for the next Bi-Annual Meeting. They shall plan for our beloved dead a memorial service to be conducted during the

Fall Bi-Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section C. FINANCE COMMITTEE, consists of five (5) members along with the Treasurer of the Association. It will follow the Financial Policies and Procedures Handbook which may be updated by the Association as needed. In addition to these policies the finance committee will have the responsibility of preparing and presenting a recommended budget to the Association in its Fall Meeting and for the distribution of all the Associational Funds. The Committee shall send the proposed budget to the senior pastor of each church in the association two weeks prior to the biannual meeting. The senior pastor has the responsibility to provide copies of the budget to the messengers from his church. The Committee shall encourage each church to contribute to the

financial needs of the Association. Further, it shall be responsible for having the Associational financial records audited or reviewed every three years.

They shall promote a program of stewardship education and development, encouraging participation in the world missions program by gifts through the cooperative program and other avenues of support.

Section D. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE, consisting of three (3) members and the associational parliamentarian(s), shall suggest changes to the Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules of Order deemed advisable, as well as receive, examine and make recommendations to the Association on proposed amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws.

Section E. MISSIONS COMMITTEE, consisting of seven (7) members (at least three (3) of these being pastors), shall work with the Associational Director of Missions in surveying and studying the missions' needs in the Associational territory - primary missions, institutional missions and every phase - making recommendations to the Executive Committee (or) Biannual meetings. They further have the responsibilities set forth in Article II and may act as the mediatorial body, when called upon to do so, when there is an actual or threatened breach of fellowship in some church. In no case shall the autonomy of the local church be infringed upon.

Section F. ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE, consisting of four (4) members with one of those being the Ministry Assistant of the Association, shall provide for, secure and maintain the record of messengers in attendance at the Biannual Meetings. Further, it shall be the duty of this Committee to investigate the credentials of any messenger that might be in question.

Section G. PERSONNEL COMMITTEE, shall consist of five members (at least three being pastors) to be appointed by the Nominating Committee and the Nominating Committee shall appoint the chairman of the Personnel Committee. This committee shall be responsible for all personnel and matters of the personnel of the association.

A. Employment

- 1. This committee shall have the responsibility of recruiting, interviewing, and recommending all staff to be called by the Association including the Director of Missions.
- 2. In order to be consistent in employment practices this committee shall use a written application form and establish procedures whereby references can be checked.
- 3. Following employment, this committee should assist in placing the new staff members on the job.
- 4. This committee shall receive and investigate reports of substandard performance by hired staff members and recommend action as deemed appropriate to the Executive Committee. A special-called business meeting of the Executive Committee may be called for such a purpose.

B. Salaries

- 1. This committee shall design a program of salary administration and make annual recommendations to the Finance Committee.
- 2. If a prospective staff member cannot be hired at the approved budgeted salary schedule, the committee may, in consultation with the Finance Committee, provide a recommendation which shall be brought before the Association for approval at a regular or called business meeting.

C. Employee Benefits

- 1. This committee shall recommend to the Association a program of employee benefits.
- 2. Eligibility for benefits shall be clearly stated as policy.

D. Job Description

- 1. The committee shall maintain current job descriptions for each paid position of the associational staff.
- 2. Each job description shall be reviewed annually and updated as appropriate.

E. Performance Review

1. The committee shall make sure all employees are aware of the standards of performance required by the association.

- 2. The personnel committee chairperson as well as a selected pastor will perform the annual evaluation of the Director of Missions.
- 3. The Director of Missions will be responsible for performing annual evaluations of all other associational staff.

Section H. CHRISTIAN LIFE/RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE, shall consist of three members to be appointed by the Nominating Committee. This committee shall prepare and submit to the association all resolutions which it deems appropriate for adoption. Proposed resolutions from individuals not members of this committee shall be submitted in writing to the committee chairperson no later than forty-five days prior to the biannual meeting. In the event of a national emergency or catastrophic event, the forty-five day period may be waived, provided that the committee has sufficient time to thoroughly review and compile the proposed resolutions prior to the printing of the

Book of Reports. The committee shall report on all matters submitted to it by the association, with or without recommendation or amendments. It shall report on any critical moral and social issues in order to provide leadership for Christian action needed to meet those needs; help churches apply the gospel to all areas of life by mobilizing and equipping members of the churches to be on mission in regard to moral and ethical concerns; and assist local churches in broader cooperative efforts and emphases.

Section I. ORDINATION COMMITTEE shall consist of six pastors that are active or retired in the association. Any church desiring to ordain a candidate to the ministry may seek the help and advice of this committee in the process of the ordination procedure.

ARTICLE III – AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. The Association shall meet biannually on the last Tuesday in April and October at such time as the Executive Committee shall decide.
- 2. All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. The messengers present at the Biannual Meetings and at all properly called meetings shall constitute a quorum. A majority shall be a quorum for all Committees.
- 4. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution,

Bylaws, or special rules of order of the Association.

- 5. As defined in Robert's Rules of Order Ex-officio members have voting privileges except in matters personal to them such as salary decision or performance discussions.
- 6. All committees' reports and resolutions shall be submitted in writing.
- 7. These Rules of Order may be amended at any session by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

Kershaw Baptist Association Minutes of Spring Session April 30, 2013 New Hope Baptist Church

The regular Kershaw Baptist Associational Spring meeting began at 7:00 p.m. Rev. Lin Hill, pastor of New Hope Baptist, welcomed everyone. Scripture and prayer were offered by Rev. Dean Elliott (Cassatt) who shared from Joshua. Rev. Steve Lee, moderator, called the meeting to order. A motion "that the printed agenda be accepted as the order of business" was made and approved. A motion "that the registered delegates become the official messengers of this meeting" was made and approved.

Terry Corder, (Mt. Pisgah) moved "to approve the minutes". The minutes were approved without corrections.

Ministry and Committee reports:

Finance Committee (report on file): Jackie Amerson, chairman, gave the annual financial report. She noted that church giving had increased over this time last year. Amerson also reminded the Association that an Interim or DOM salary had not been paid out of funds the first few months of the fiscal year. The Finance Committee has conducted an internal audit for the fiscal year 2012. No irregularities were found. Amerson also reported that the KBA had entered into a new copier lease that will save \$200 - \$400 per month. Amerson on behalf of the Finance Committee made a motion" to accept the printed financial report". The motion carried.

Home Repair (report on file): Carolyn Dease, co-director, shared the number of people in Kershaw County who need home repairs. Marie Sheheen, Housing Coordinator with the United Way, spoke on the tremendous housing needs that she encounters through United Way. The KBA is one of the few volunteer groups that assist residents with housing needs through the United Way. Dease stressed the need to have more churches participate with home repairs.

Senior Adult Ministry: Buster Morris, director, reported on the Senior Adult Fair that was held at Malvern Hill Baptist Church last September. The Senior Adult Fair will be held this year on September 17. 2013. Morris reported that the Senior Adult Mission trip to Lynch, KT has 34 adults attending. They will leave on Monday, May 6, 2013.

Kershaw Baptist Association Minutes of Fall Meeting October 29, 2013 Springvale Baptist Church

AFTERNOON SESSION:

Following pre-session music by David Amos of Springvale Baptist Church, Rev. Todd Horton, pastor of the host church, welcomed the messengers and guests to the meeting. Sixty-four messengers and forty-eight guests were present.

Scripture and prayer were offered by Rev. Jerry Gardner, pastor of Faith Baptist Church. Rev. Dean Elliott, moderator, called the meeting to order. A motion "to adopt the agenda as the order of business" was made and approved. The minutes were noted and approved as printed.

Interim Director of Missions, Don Purvis, spoke of nominating Steve Lee, pastor of Mt. Olivet, as the 2013 Smaller Church Pastor of the Year for the South Carolina Baptist Convention. He recognized Monty Hale, director, Pastoral Ministries and Bivocational Office for the convention, who presented the award to Rev. Lee. Hale listed several of Lee's accomplishments in leadership in his twenty-one years at Mt. Olivet, including going or leading church members to go on mission trips to twenty-five countries, his ministry to his church and the community, leading others to go to Bible college or seminary, baptizing forty individuals in seven years, among other accomplishments. Lee accepted the award and challenged the churches to get deep into missions for Jesus.

Tom Turner, director of the South Carolina Baptist Ministry for the Aging, thanked the messengers for their support of the two South Carolina campuses. He also spoke of a new resource ministry for senior adults that will serve as a conduit when they need services.

Interim Director of Missions Report: Don Purvis

Highlights of his last meeting with us as Interim Director of Missions:

- Speaking from Acts 1:8, Dr. Purvis asked us to consider where we are going. He encouraged us to live
 empowered by the Holy Spirit and not by the law. He said that missions start at home and reaches
 around the world.
- He encouraged everyone to give to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. Two-thirds of the International Missions Board budget come from this offering.
- This is the Association's third year partnering with Peru. This year we will investigate another country where it will be a little easier for women to join us.
- North American mission emphasis is on planting churches, especially in major metropolitan areas. The Missions Committee is investigating a North American church with which we can partner.
- State missions is supported by our giving to the Cooperative Program.
- Purvis said we tend to think about the Association as a building, but it is an association of churches
 working together. Wherever the lost are, we need to be comfortable working together to lead them to
 Christ.

• It is up to us to get together, work together, pray together, and get some things done – as a church, and as an Association. Together we can win some, to win some, to win some.

Page 2, Minutes of the Fall Meeting of October 29, 2013

Moderator Dean Elliott reiterated that pastors should not feel they are in competition with each other, rather if we get together and work together, we can do a lot of things together. He also asked the pastors to consider becoming a part of the Band of Brothers ministry that the South Carolina Baptist Convention has begun under the leadership of Monty Hale. The ministry will help build relationships with those pastors around us, making it a lot easier to work together.

Personnel Committee: Terry Corder, Chairman

He recognized and showed appreciation for the members of this newly formed committee: David Turner, Abney; Sandy Martin, Cassatt; Charlotte Morris, Malvern Hill; Jason Fletcher, Hermitage; Dean Elliott as Moderator, and Don Purvis as Interim Director of Missions.

- Emphasized that as an Association we need to give it our all to reach the lost. We need churches, we need our Association to pull us together at the local level; we need our state convention to pull us together at the state level, and we need the Southern Baptist Convention to pull us together as a denomination to impact the world.
- Money is tight and the economy is bad, so the committee has had to make tough decisions. We've had to think about those folds who need the Lord and using our resources toward that.
- Made recommendation of an updated job description for the ministry assistant. Pointed out that clerk and Sacks of Love coordinator has been added to job description.
- New office hours will be Monday Thursday, 8:30 a.m. 5:00 p.m. and closed on Fridays.
- Made recommendation of an updated job description for the Director of Missions. Biggest change is due to the budget, we are pursuing a part-time director, rather than full time. He will work two days a week. Salary for this position will be \$55,000.00, which includes everything: retirement, insurance, travel, cell, housing, and salary. After a short discussion the recommendation passed.
- For information, Corder announced that Pat Stokes had resigned her position as part-time ministry assistant, effective December 31, 2013. The messengers showed appreciation to her by their applause. The position will not be filled due to cutbacks, but money has been budgeted to hire someone as need for heavy times of the year.
- He thanked Kathy Hall, ministry assistant, and Don Purvis, Interim Director, for their work.

Treasurer Report: Wanda Davis

Davis called attention to the printed reports that were given as information.

Budget Presentation: Jason Fletcher, chairman

- Presented an Acts 1:8 budget with an emphasis in two areas: focus on strengthening churches (called revitalization) and church planting.
- Church revitalization is offered through programs with the South Carolina Baptist Convention. They will come in and get a pulse back to dying churches. There is a charge for it. This budget will help churches that want the help.

Page 3, Minutes of the Fall Meeting of October 29, 2013

• Under missions, we have added North American Church Planting. This line item will be designated toward church planters, not mission trips. Currently we are focusing on Cleveland, Ohio.

- Mission Committee asked for \$2000.00 above last year's budget to help with a vision trip international, as our Peru partnership comes to an end.
- The committee used recommendations from the Personnel Committee for personnel salaries. Ministry Assistant reduction in salary is partly offset by increase in benefits, and closing of the office on Friday. Director of Missions reduction is due to pursuing a part-time director. The part-time ministry assistant position will not be filled.
- Missions Operation is showing a tremendous savings, and is directly tied to what is expected for 2014.

The recommendation was made to approve the 2014 budget as presented. After a short discussion, the recommendation passed.

Missions Committee: Steve Lee, chairman

- Called attention to the written report.
- Called on John Corder, Hillcrest, to give a report of the vision trip to Cleveland. Corder said there are 1.6 million people in the metro area, but there is only one Southern Baptist Church per 42,000 people. Statistics show that 47% of people in the area are not affiliated with Christianity. Population is 53% African American, 37% Anglo, 8% Hispanic, and 2% Asian. Cleveland is the second poorest city in America. Corder asked the messengers to pray for the church plants, give money and resources, and go to support the mission efforts and building relationships. Pray about partnering and how your church can be involved.
- Lee called the area of mission work of the local church Judea; the area of Cleveland as Samaria, and Peru and other international countries as the uttermost parts of the world we are touching. We are encouraging churches to touch them.
- We will continue our Peru partnership during our third year with trips to target the Urarina peoples
 along the Tigrillo River. Trips will be announced as far in advance as possible. Lee encouraged anyone
 interested in going or leading a trip next year should contact the KBA office by the end of January so
 that funds can be fairly allocated.
- \$2000.00 is included in the budget for a vision trip for future outreach in another international mission
- Lee said there is a desire to know of all of our churches that are already involved in missions either locally or in South Carolina. There may be others who would like to join the efforts of those who already have relationships established in a particular area.
- Lee called attention to the final accounting report of donations and expenses for the Milagros fund. She is the young girl in Peru who had the cleft pallet and lip. Donations were received to help with corrective surgeries.

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Miscellaneous Business

Angie Ogburn of Lugoff First introduced the messengers to "Winshape Camps," started by Truett Cathy of Chick-fil-A. She said printed information will be available at the meal.

Dean Elliott – He mentioned that My Hope with Billy Graham will be in a few days and reminded the messengers that it's not too late to get involved.

David Turner offered a few words and a prayer in memory of church members who passed away during the past year and asked a blessing for the food before recessing from the conference.

EVENING SESSION – 7:00 p.m.

Following pre-service music by David Amos and Shana Herndon, Jerry Gardner, Vice-moderator, welcomed everyone back to the conference.

Ministry Reports:

Senior Adult Ministry: Buster Morris

- Senior Adult Fair saw more than 30 churches participating. More than 200 people were fed. The Silvertones from Camden First sang after lunch. Dr. Jimmy Epting, president of North Greenville University.
- The senior adult mission trip to Lynch, Kentucky is tentatively scheduled for May 5-9, 2014.

Woman's Missionary Union: Vada Arant

- WMU Fall Training Meeting was held August 27, 2013, at Mt. Pisgah Baptist Church. Fifty-five women and men attended the training sessions.
- Age-level consultants are needed. Arant said that a man is needed to serve on WMU Council as RA consultant.
- Associational WMU can assist the churches in their missions endeavors. Other information may be
 found online at the National WMU website: www.wmu.org, or the State WMU: www.scwmu.org.
- GAs will have a 100th Birthday Party, November 2, Spring Valley Baptist Church, Columbia.
- WMU celebrates 125th year in 2014. Part of the celebration is the making of associational quilts.
 Twenty churches have submitted quilt squares. The quilt will be on display at the Annual State WMU Spring Meeting.
- Rita Roberts was called on to speak about Baptist Women's World Day of Prayer on November 4. There will be two choices of services: Camden First, 9:30 10:30 a.m. and Mt. Pisgah Church, 6:30-7:30 p.m. She mentioned "Call to Pray" resources on the table in the foyer.
- Roberts also called attention to the International Mission Study, noting that the study is on Peru.

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- Judy Caulder was called on to tell about Christmas Prisoner Packets. She encouraged everyone to follow the list of items for the packets exactly. Packets are due at the KBA mission center November 20. This may be the only opportunity for them to hear the Gospel. Last year we supplied 713 kits. This year we have committed to providing 800.
- Caulder mentioned that "We're Here for You" will be November 9. The theme this year is "We're here and we care in Jesus' name. Flyers are available in the foyer.
- Other mission action projects are also listed and available in the foyer.
- Caulder reported that Sacks of Love Kentucky is expanding to another area.
- Arant closed her report with the statement that this is not the church's WMU or her WMU, rather it is God's WMU, and everything they do, they try to bring glory to God.

Buster Morris mentioned that men from the associational churches are giving the prisoner packets to the inmates at Lee County Correctional and Wateree River Correctional. The date will be December 2. Help is needed to distribute the kits. Encouraged the men to call the associational office to help.

Prayer Ministry: Pat Young

- Encouraged messengers to read the printed information in the program.
- Attended White Oak Conference Center for a day of prayer.
- Resources are available in the foyer to help grow your prayer life.

Midlands Women's Center: Bobby James

Vision is to become a Medical Pregnancy Center with ultrasound machine within five years. Fund raising will be done throughout the year. Fish Fry fundraiser will be held November 6 at Oak Ridge. Tickets may be purchased at the KBA Mission Center or Midlands Women's Center, or from James.

Harvest Seeds Ministry: Bobby James

• A way to multiply your ministry without costing anything more is to donate your old literature, Bibles, hymnals, CDs, videos and some books. Some of the material will be used to train pastors. Box up your material and take it to the associational office. James will see that it arrives at a collection point to be shipped overseas to people who are desperate to have a written word of God.

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Don Purvis recognized new pastors/associates in the Association since the Spring Meeting: Thomas Greig, pastor, Fox Hill; Bobby James, pastor, Oak Ridge; Eric Boone, pastor, Pine Grove; Phillip Gerrald, associate pastor, Camden First; Robert Ridley, pastor, Freedom Outreach.

Dean Elliott introduced Brad Hendrix, pastor of Shamrock, who delivered the associational sermon after the Springvale Church Choir presented special music. The title of his message was "Seeking Kingdom Power," using Mark 9:1-10 as the Scripture passage.
