Two elected messengers and one additional for each fifty members or fraction thereof *(maximum 15)* from each member church.

All business is conducted during these meetings. Each church representative has voting rights, receives written reports and financial statements, and is encouraged to report on the association at regular church business meetings.

Kershaw Baptist Association CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS AND RULES OF ORDER

CONSTITUTION

Preamble: We, the messengers of the Kershaw Baptist Association, from the churches of the Southern Baptist Convention of Kershaw County, South Carolina, and adjacent areas, do hereby agree to certain fundamental principles, which amended from time to time are as follows:

ARTICLE I – NAME

This body shall be known as "The Kershaw Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION

- A. Membership in this body shall be confined to churches which conform to the New Testament doctrines of faith and practice as described in the Baptist Faith and Message (2000) and which cooperate with and financially support the association, the South Carolina Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.
- B. This Association shall be composed of messengers chosen by each church cooperating with the Association. Each church shall be entitled to two messengers and to one additional messenger for each fifty members or fraction thereof with a maximum representation of fifteen (15) messengers from any one church. (Director of Missions and officers do not count against the quota of the churches of which they are members.) The DOM and officers referred to in Article V shall be messengers by virtue of the office held.
- C. Churches desiring to affiliate with the Kershaw Baptist Association shall submit a written request for membership to the Missions Committee as least thirty (30) days before a biannual Executive Meeting. The Missions Committee shall make a thorough investigation of the petitioning church as to its doctrine, practices, and support of the total program of work and shall report on the petition at the biannual session of the Association, recommending one of the following courses of action:
 - 1. Acceptance of the church into the Kershaw Baptist Association
 - 2. Rejection of the petition or
 - 3. Watchcare, to allow for additional study

The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee. Unless the Missions Committee recommends that a church's request be rejected, all petitioning churches will be received under watchcare for their first year. Watchcare will be under

supervision of the Missions Committee.

- D. Watchcare churches will:
 - 1. Provide a copy of the Constitution and By-laws, current leadership roster and document of incorporation by the state, if incorporated.
 - 2. Complete and return the Annual Church Profile.
 - 3. Begin or continue missions giving through the Association.
 - 4. Fulfill any additional prerequisites specified by the Missions Team.

When churches have fulfilled the responsibilities of their watchcare year, the Missions Committee will recommend that their watchcare period be approved as completed. Such approval will normally come in the Biannual Meeting the year after the watchcare begins. Should any of the above responsibilities lack completion or any significant issue need resolution, the recommendation to prolong the watchcare status will be brought to the Executive Committee.

- E. Waiving the Watchcare. The watchcare year may be waived for a church which is transferring from another association. This church must come from a neighboring association and be transferring with a good report from that association. They also must fulfill the four obligations listed above. The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee.
- F. Withdrawal of member churches from the Kershaw Baptist Association may be accomplished by written statement to the association.
- G. Dismissal of a church may be recommended by the Missions Committee for those who are not conforming to section A or who does not turn in their ACP Report for a period of three (3) consecutive years. This motion would be brought up at an Executive Committee for discussion and vote and if the motion is approved for dismissal, then the church would be brought to a vote for dismissal at a biannual meeting with no discussion. The Missions team will work with the church to see that they are brought into a proper relationship with the Association before any action is taken.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purpose of the Kershaw Baptist Association is to serve its member churches. The Association is a family of autonomous churches in a voluntary partnership, uniquely joined together to follow God's leadership for carrying out the full scope of the Great Commission. The Association shall endeavor to: build fellowship among the churches thus resulting in

teamwork and unity; provide leadership development opportunities which will enable the churches and their staff to be effective in their ministry; help churches discover immediate needs within their community and determine how

those needs can be met; engage in cooperative mission efforts which exceed the capabilities of any one church alone: discover, enlist, and deploy volunteers in mission service at home and abroad; serve as an information and resource network; promote the work of the kingdom throughout the world in cooperation with other Baptist agencies.

ARTICLE IV - REPORTS FROM THE CHURCHES

The churches are expected to submit their Annual Church Profile to the Kershaw Baptist Association before the Fall Meeting, see Article 2 section G.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Finance Committee Chairperson, Personnel Committee Chairperson, Missions Committee Chairperson, Historian, Parliamentarian, three Trustees, WMU Director, and other ministry leaders as needed. They shall be elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting of the Association. The Nominating Committee shall present a nominee for each office. Other nominations are in order from the floor. These officers shall be elected by majority vote of those present and voting. Their term of office shall

be one-year beginning upon their election at the July Executive Committee Meeting. The Moderator may not be elected to more than two consecutive terms. The Trustees shall serve terms of three years unless otherwise specified at the time of their election. No Trustee shall be eligible to succeed himself until one year has elapsed. All officers shall be members of churches cooperating with the Association. Officers may be removed by a 2/3 vote at any Executive Committee or Bi-Annual Meeting for cause.

ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

The duties of Associational officers shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Association, Director of Missions, pastors of cooperating churches, and two additional members elected by each church. The officers of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee shall transact the business of the association during the interim between annual meetings. It shall meet two times annually, once in January and once in July, as set forth in the Calendar of Activities or by call of the Moderator if found necessary. The members present shall constitute a quorum, with notice having been given of the meeting. The Committee shall report its actions to the Fall Meeting of the Association by the minutes of the Clerk. The moderator may call special meetings of the Executive Committee as he may deem necessary, with written notice being sent to members ten days prior to the meeting and such notices informing members of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

The Association shall have the Standing committees listed below along with any other committee authorized by the Association and each member will serve a three year term except the Nominating Committee as it is a one year term. The Director of Missions and Moderator will serve as ex-officio members of all Associational Committees.

- A. Nominating Committee
- B. Program Committee
- C. Finance Committee
- D. Constitution and Bylaws Committee
- E. Missions Committee
- F. Enrollment Committee
- G. Personnel Committee
- H. Christian/Life Committee
- I. Ordination Committee

ARTICLE IX - ADMINISTRATION

The Director of Missions and other employees of the Association shall be charged with responsibility of the promotion of the whole program of the Association and Denomination. They shall work under the direction of and in cooperation with the Personnel Committee. They shall be nominated by the Personnel Committee of the Association, and elected by the Association at any Biannual Session, or by the Executive Committee if the next Biannual Session of the Association is thirty (30) days or more beyond the date on which the employees are nominated.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

BYLAWS

The work of the Association shall be governed by the following Bylaws.

ARTICLE I - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section A. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the Bi-Annual and Executive Committee Meetings. This person shall see that order and decorum are observed by all messengers.

Section B. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Moderator to preside in the absence, or upon the request of the Moderator. This officer shall assist the Moderator in the carrying out of his duties to the best interest of the Association. The Vice-Moderator shall accede to the office of Moderator should that office become vacant.

Section C. The clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, publish and distribute the Annual Minutes, and perform such other duties as the interest of the Association may require. Further, the clerk shall keep the minutes of the Executive Committee meetings and report same to the Biannual Meeting of the Association. For this service, the clerk shall receive all necessary expenses and remuneration as stipulated in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section D. The Treasurer shall be responsible for presenting the financial report of the Association to the executive committee and at the annual and bi-annual associational meetings. The Treasurer serves as ex-officio member of the Finance Committee. The treasurer cannot be an employee of the association.

Section E. The Historian shall record important things that happen during the year. The historian shall also keep on file articles and items of interest relating to the churches of the Association. The Historian shall be reimbursed for all expenses incurred in the execution of his duties as provided for in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section F. The Parliamentarian is an advisor to the Moderator and shall, upon the Moderator's request, render to the Moderator and/or Association whatever service is needed.

Section G. There shall be three trustees who shall hold title to all property of the Association, whether real or otherwise, and shall execute such transfers of title, or signature, only as authorized by the Association. They shall be responsible for the upkeep of Associational property.

Section H. All other ministry leaders shall promote and supervise their programs in the Association in cooperation with the administrative staff.

ARTICLE II - COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

The Moderator and Director of Missions at the Spring Meeting shall appoint five persons to comprise the Nominating Committee to report at the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all Kershaw Baptist Association officers, committees, and ministry leaders. Nominations

from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the elected leaders serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Nominations for vacancies

occurring between business sessions may be presented at any Biannual or Executive Committee for election.

Section A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE, consisting of five (5) persons appointed by the Moderator and Director of Missions, shall report to the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all associational officers, ministry leaders, and other committees. Nominations from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the Committee members serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Persons to fill vacancies occurring between business sessions may be presented for election by the Executive Committee.

Section B. PROGRAM COMMITTEE, consisting of six (6) members (Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Associational Music Director and three members selected by the nominating committee), shall prepare the Program for the Biannual Sessions. The suggested program shall

be presented in printed form to the Association at the beginning of the session for action. They shall recommend to the Association at the Bi-Annual Meeting: the time, place, speaker, and alternate for the next Bi-Annual Meeting. They shall plan for our beloved dead a memorial service to be conducted during the Fall Bi-Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section C. FINANCE COMMITTEE, consists of five (5) members along with the Treasurer of the Association. It will follow the Financial Policies and Procedures Handbook which may be updated by the Association as needed. In addition to these policies the finance committee will have the responsibility of preparing and presenting a recommended budget to the Association in its Fall Meeting and for the distribution of all the Associational Funds. The Committee shall send the proposed budget to the senior pastor of each church in the association two weeks prior to the biannual meeting. The senior pastor has the responsibility to provide copies of the budget to the messengers from his church. The Committee shall encourage each church to contribute to the

financial needs of the Association. Further, it shall be responsible for having the Associational financial records audited or reviewed every three years.

They shall promote a program of stewardship education and development, encouraging participation in the world missions program by gifts through the cooperative program and other avenues of support.

Section D. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE, consisting of three (3) members and the associational parliamentarian(s), shall suggest changes to the Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules of Order deemed advisable, as well as receive, examine and make recommendations to the Association on proposed amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws.

Section E. MISSIONS COMMITTEE, consisting of seven (7) members (at least three (3) of these being pastors), shall work with the Associational Director of Missions in surveying and studying the missions' needs in the Associational territory - primary missions, institutional missions and every phase - making recommendations to the Executive Committee (or) Biannual meetings. They further have the responsibilities set forth in Article II and may act as the mediatorial body, when called upon to do so, when there is an actual or threatened breach of fellowship in some church. In no case shall the autonomy of the local church be infringed upon.

Section F. ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE, consisting of four (4) members with one of those being the Ministry Assistant of the Association, shall provide for, secure and maintain the record of messengers in attendance at the Biannual Meetings. Further, it shall be the duty of this Committee to investigate the credentials of any messenger that might be in question.

Section G. PERSONNEL COMMITTEE, shall consist of five members (at least three being pastors) to be appointed by the Nominating Committee and the Nominating Committee shall appoint the chairman of the Personnel Committee. This committee shall be responsible for all personnel and matters of the personnel of the association.

A. Employment

- 1. This committee shall have the responsibility of recruiting, interviewing, and recommending all staff to be called by the Association including the Director of Missions.
- 2. In order to be consistent in employment practices this committee shall use a written application form and establish procedures whereby references can be checked.
- 3. Following employment, this committee should assist in placing the new staff members on the job.
- 4. This committee shall receive and investigate reports of substandard performance by hired staff members and recommend action as deemed appropriate to the Executive Committee. A special-called business meeting of the Executive Committee may be called for such a purpose.

B. Salaries

- 1. This committee shall design a program of salary administration and make annual recommendations to the Finance Committee.
- 2. If a prospective staff member cannot be hired at the approved budgeted salary schedule, the committee may, in consultation with the Finance Committee, provide a recommendation which shall be brought before the Association for approval at a regular or called business meeting.

C. Employee Benefits

- 1. This committee shall recommend to the Association a program of employee benefits.
- 2. Eligibility for benefits shall be clearly stated as policy.

D. Job Description

- 1. The committee shall maintain current job descriptions for each paid position of the associational staff.
- 2. Each job description shall be reviewed annually and updated as appropriate.

E. Performance Review

- 1. The committee shall make sure all employees are aware of the standards of performance required by the association.
- 2. The personnel committee chairperson as well as a selected pastor will perform

the annual evaluation of the Director of Missions.

3. The Director of Missions will be responsible for performing annual evaluations of all other associational staff.

Section H. CHRISTIAN LIFE/RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE, shall consist of three members to be appointed by the Nominating Committee. This committee shall prepare and submit to the association all resolutions which it deems appropriate for adoption. Proposed resolutions from individuals not members of this committee shall be submitted in writing to the committee chairperson no later than forty-five days prior to the biannual meeting. In the event of a national emergency or catastrophic event, the forty-five day period may be waived, provided that the committee has sufficient time to thoroughly review and compile the proposed resolutions prior to the printing of the

Book of Reports. The committee shall report on all matters submitted to it by the association, with or without recommendation or amendments. It shall report on any critical moral and social issues in order to provide leadership for Christian action needed to meet those needs; help churches apply the gospel to all areas of life by mobilizing and equipping members of the churches to be on mission in regard to moral and ethical concerns; and assist local churches in broader cooperative efforts and emphases.

Section I. ORDINATION COMMITTEE shall consist of six pastors that are active or retired in the association. Any church desiring to ordain a candidate to the ministry may seek the help and advice of this committee in the process of the ordination procedure.

ARTICLE III – AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. The Association shall meet biannually on the last Tuesday in April and October at such time as the Executive Committee shall decide.
- 2. All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. The messengers present at the Biannual Meetings and at all properly called meetings shall constitute a quorum. A majority shall be a quorum for all Committees.
- 4. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution, Bylaws, or special rules of order of the Association.

- 5. As defined in Robert's Rules of Order Ex-officio members have voting privileges except in matters personal to them such as salary decision or performance discussions.
- 6. All committees' reports and resolutions shall be submitted in writing.
- 7. These Rules of Order may be amended at any session by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

Kershaw Baptist Association Minutes of the Executive Committee Meeting January 14, 2014

Dean Elliott, moderator, opened with prayer and then called the meeting to order. There were thirty-seven Executive members present.

Minutes of the 2013 Fall Meeting were not available.

Treasurer Wanda Davis presented the financial reports for information.

Personnel Committee: Terry Corder

Reported that the Association was blessed to have had Don Purvis as interim director for eight months. Due to his wife's declining health, he resigned at the end of 2013. He had many accomplishments. Having been challenged with goals, he was able to meet them.

The committee is still searching for the next director of missions. Going to a part-time position has mad the search more difficult.

Corder then recommended Rev. Chris Hanley as the next interim director. Chris has served as missionary with the International Mission Board serving in East Asia – January 2006 to December 2012. He was Associate Director of Baptist Campus Ministry at Virginia Tech (250 student participants) – July 2002 to June 2005, and was a missionary with SIM International in Peru – December 1996 – May 1997. In addition to missionary experience and his present interim minister to students at Camden First, Chris has also served as Interim Associate Pastor at Camden First from May 2013 – December 2013. He previously served as interim youth minister at Camden First from June 2001 – June 2002.

Corder stated that Don Purvis helped us with administrative matters. He said that now, with our focus on missions, Chris Hanley will be the one for helping us. He will work two days a week – Tuesdays and Thursdays. Compensation will remain the same. Committee will work with Hanley on the breakdown of housing and salary within the compensation budget.

Corder then made the following motion:

"On behalf of the Personnel Committee, I bring the recommendation to call Chris Hanley as interim director of missions."

The motion passed. Corder stated that Hanley will begin serving January 20, and will keep the interim position he holds at Camden First.

Missions Committee: Steve Lee

As we aim for an Acts 11:8 strategy, Lee reported that we are looking at the Spring Meeting as a possible Missions conference. More information will be announced at a later date.

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Cleveland: If you are interested in going on a vision tour, there will be another trip the first week of March and another in September.

Lee proposed:

"That we adopt Cleveland, Ohio with the North American Mission Board (NAMB) as a partner city."

He noted that if we adopt, we will begin planning a trip for this summer. Perimeters will be presented at the Spring Meeting. We will be working with NAMB church planters. Money was budgeted at the fall meeting to finance a North American work. The motion passed. He said consideration is being given to form a Cleveland sub-committee.

Peru: This is the third year of our partnership. Lee gave a brief report of the mission trip he led to Peru in December. He noted there are two churches there that were non-existent when our partnership started. He will be looking into what needs to be done to bring the partnership to a close.

Woman's Missionary Union: Vada Arant

Arant thanked the twenty-two churches that contributed 975 Christmas Prisoner Packets last month. We exceeded the state's request for 800.

Twenty churches provided quilt squares for our associational quilt which will be presented at the State WMU Annual Meeting in Florence in March, as we celebrate WMU's 125th birthday. Plans are being made to display it in the associational mission center.

The Associational WMU Spring Meeting will be held April 8, 6:30 p.m. A church is needed to host the meeting. There is also a need for people to serve in leadership. She stressed the importance of leadership and noted that we need to be teaching our children and youth about missions.

The bylaws are being revised and will hopefully be completed before the Spring Meeting.

A church is needed to host the Fall Training Meeting, tentatively scheduled for August 12.

Arant requested prayer for the leadership that is needed to assist our churches in their missions projects and programs.

Home Repair: Carolyn Dease

Interest meeting for the next home repair blitz will be announced soon.

She noted a house in Lee County that needs repairs. Pastor Jerry Gardner and Faith Church are willing to do the labor, but they need donations before scheduling. The floors are falling in and the house also needs shingles.

Moderator's Report: Dean Elliott

Referred to Isaiah 40 and encouraged everyone to patiently wait upon the Lord He is looking forward to whomever the Lord sends as director of missions. He said it will be hard until then, but the Lord will send the correct person to guide us. When God gives him to us, we will "mount up with wings like eagles, we will run and not be weary, we shall walk and not faint." Elliott said we should share together and cooperate as an association. We should also pray that God sends the one He wants to

Elliott encouraged pastors to attend the Band of Brothers meeting at White Oak Conference Center.

Kershaw Baptist Association Minutes of Spring Session April 29, 2014 Trinity Baptist Church

The regular Kershaw Baptist Associational Spring meeting began at 7:00 p.m., with 83 messengers representing 26 of our 49 churches.

Following the prelude and call to worship, Rev. Chuck Everett, pastor of Trinity Baptist, welcomed everyone. The meeting was called to order by Dean Elliott, moderator. A motion "that the printed agenda be accepted as the order of business" was made and approved.

After the minutes from the previous meetings were approved, Ray Lowe, pastor of Buffalo Baptist, read scripture from I Corinthians 3:10-23 and offered a prayer.

Chris Hanley, interim director of missions, interviewed a missions panel regarding their churches' involvement in missions. Members of the panel were Fran Stokes, Southside; Vada Arant, Springvale; and Sandy Martin, Cassatt. Hanley followed the interview with a prayer for mission involvement in our churches and association.

Ministry and Committee reports:

Personnel Committee: Terry Corder, chairman, thanked Chris Hanley for his leadership in the interim period. He then recognized members of the Personnel Committee and thanked them for their work in recommending a candidate for the director of missions position. Members of the committee are Jason Fletcher, Hermitage; David Turner, Abney; Sandy Martin, Cassatt; Charlotte Morris, Malvern Hill; and ex-officio member Dean Elliott, moderator, Cassatt.

Corder introduced the candidate, Ron Underwood and his wife Paulette. (resume is on file).

Underwood gave a little background on him and his wife, and shared his scripture theme verse of I Corinthians 9:22. He said he preferred to be call an associational missionary, rather than director of missions because a director tells someone what to do; a missionary tells someone about Jesus. He said he loves what we're doing already with other ministries, but there is so much more that can be done. He will be sensitive as God leads.

Corder then made the following motion:

In behalf of the Personnel Committee, we move that Kershaw Baptist Association extend a call to Ron Underwood to serve as associational missionary.

The motion passed, and Underwood accepted the call to serve.

Corder noted that compensation for Underwood will be:

Salary: \$21,000.00 Housing: 24,000.00 Reimbursable Ministry Related Expenses 10,000.00

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Finance Committee (report on file): Moderator Dean Elliott called attention to printed financial reports for information. He said if there were questions, Treasurer Wanda Davis would answer. There were no questions.

Prayer Ministry: Pat Young, coordinator, reminded everyone of the National Day of Prayer on May 1. A special time set aside for prayer for the needs of our nation and community will be held at the KBA Mission Center from 10 a.m. - 12:00 noon. Another would be held at Cassatt at 7 p.m. She mentioned a time of Spiritual Renewal through Prayer. Time and location will be announced later. She would like to post a monthly prayer calendar beginning in June and asked that requests be sent to her.

WMU (report on file): Vada Arant, director, encouraged everyone to read the printed WMU report. WMU is building a data base through the surveys that were returned at their spring meeting earlier in the month. She asked that anyone who had not returned their survey to make a point to return it.

Arant announced that the Associational WMU quilt was on display in the KBA Mission Center and could be signed in and out for events in the churches.

- ESL classes at Southside are growing. There is a need for materials to work with the children.
- Alice Jackson, Trinity Baptist, has accepted the Missions Friends consultant position.
- Project Help emphasis is PTSD (Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder)
- Theme for children's missions this year is "All for You."

Associational Missionary Report: Ron Underwood

- Referred to John 17, where Jesus prayed for us that we may all be one. Jesus prayed these words just before his death on the cross. Underwood's goal is to work toward that kind of unity in the Association.
- Trying to communicate with everyone, especially our pastors.
- Secured SCBC funds for a hunting event this fall.
- Looking at how we do missions, and is coordinating with churches and pastors.
- Taking a close look at the Missions Committee and will be meeting with them on a monthly basis. Thinks it is important to break it down into groups of emphasis on local, national and international missions.
- Missions is primary
 - Local Hispanic ministry, possible church plant just outside Lugoff, presence at the Cup races, Sacks of Love ministry
 - Met with Camden's mayor and talked of other possibilities of involvement.
- Wants to use website to connect churches on mission trips. Smaller churches might join larger churches.
- Internationally Peru partnership is coming to a close. Looking at offering multiple partnerships: one easy, one medium, and one harder. Discussions have been on London, Caribbean, Guyana and Cuba.

- As Associational Missionary, Underwood will take lead on mission tours and welcomes others to go with him.

Also spoke with Josh Austin, formerly from Camden, who is also serving with NAMB in New York City. Not a big presence of Christians. Hermitage Church was there and sponsored a Backyard Bible Club in the park. Some of the adults were able to make contact with other adults in the park. Sunday morning the church pant had eight persons attend as a direct result of Hermitage's park evangelism. Underwood said he is interested in taking a group this fall, and next summer be able to send a team from KBA churches every week in June, July and August.
- Planning a leadership retreat for Saturday, August 23. E asked everyone to pray, asking God to give us a vision about what we should do as an association.

More mission reports were given from the following: Terry Corder, Mt. Pisgah, on Cleveland, Ohio, and Associational Senior Adult Coordinator Buster Morris, Malvern Hill, on Lynch, Kentucky.

Monty Hale of the South Carolina Baptist Convention interviewed a panel of ministers who are members of the Band of Brothers.

Special music was presented by the praise team of Emmanuel Church, and then mission reports were given by Amy Fletcher, Hermitage, on Clifton, New Jersey, and Jerry Ussery and Harvey Jones, DeKalb, reported on New York City/Long Island, New York.

Underwood introduced Jamie Rogers, North American missionary serving Long Island, who presented the message.

Business:

New York City Partnership – Associational Missions Development Director, Craigan Blankenship, Bethany, made the following motion:

"The Missions Committee of the Kershaw Baptist Association, after much prayer and

Grant from the Baptist Foundation – Robert Grant of the Baptist Foundation, presented a check for \$5000.00 to Kathy Hall for Kershaw Baptist Association's Sacks of Love Ministry to assist with the purchasing of milk for the backpack program that distributes food to students attending school in Kershaw County who have little or no food to eat on the weekends.

Associational Missionary Report - Underwood announced that Jimmy Atkerson would be retiring at the end of October, having served as pastor of Emmanuel Church for thirty-three years. He then announced the coming of three new pastors to associational churches. They are Odell Sullivan, Laurel Hill, who started June 22; Danny Hedgepath who begins at Antioch on November 2; and Taylor Wells who begins at Wateree on November 16.

Underwood also reported results of the Sportsman's Banquets which resulted in twenty-five coming for salvation and thirty-seven rededicating their lives to Christ.
