CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS AND RULES OF ORDER

CONSTITUTION

Preamble: We, the messengers of the Kershaw Baptist Association, from the churches of the Southern Baptist Convention of Kershaw County, South Carolina, and adjacent areas, do hereby agree to certain fundamental principles, which amended from time to time are as follows:

ARTICLE I – NAME

This body shall be known as "The Kershaw Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION

- A. Membership in this body shall be confined to churches which conform to the New Testament doctrines of faith and practice as described in the Baptist Faith and Message (2000) and which cooperate with and financially support the association, the South Carolina Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.
- B. This Association shall be composed of messengers chosen by each church cooperating with the Association. Each church shall be entitled to two messengers and to one additional messenger for each fifty members or fraction thereof with a maximum representation of fifteen (15) messengers from any one church. (Director of Missions and officers do not count against the quota of the churches of which they are members.) The DOM and officers referred to in Article V shall be messengers by virtue of the office held.
- C. Churches desiring to affiliate with the Kershaw Baptist Association shall submit a written request for membership to the Missions Committee as least thirty (30) days before a biannual Executive Meeting. The Missions Committee shall make a thorough investigation of the petitioning church as to its doctrine, practices, and support of the total program of work and shall report on the petition at the biannual session of the Association, recommending one of the following courses of action:
 - 1. Acceptance of the church into the Kershaw Baptist Association
 - 2. Rejection of the petition or
 - 3. Watchcare, to allow for additional study

The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee. Unless the Missions Committee recommends that a church's request be rejected, all petitioning churches will be received under watchcare for their first year. Watchcare will be under supervision of the Missions Committee.

D. Watchcare churches will:

1. Provide a copy of the Constitution and By-laws, current leadership roster and document of incorporation by the state, if incorporated.
2. Complete and return the Annual Church Profile.
3. Begin or continue missions giving through the Association.
4. Fulfill any additional prerequisites specified by the Missions Team.

When churches have fulfilled the responsibilities of their watchcare year, the Missions Committee will recommend that their watchcare period be approved as completed. Such approval will normally come in the Biannual Meeting the year after the watchcare begins. Should any of the above responsibilities lack completion or any significant issue need resolution, the recommendation to prolong the watchcare status will be brought to the Executive Committee.

- E. Waiving the Watchcare. The watchcare year may be waived for a church which is transferring from another association. This church must come from a neighboring association and be transferring with a good report from that association. They also must fulfill the four obligations listed above. The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee.
- F. Withdrawal of member churches from the Kershaw Baptist Association may be accomplished by written statement to the association.
- G. Dismissal of a church may be recommended by the Missions Committee for those who are not conforming to section A or who does not turn in their ACP Report for a period of three (3) consecutive years. This motion would be brought up at an Executive Committee for discussion and vote and if the motion is approved for dismissal, then the church would be brought to a vote for dismissal at a biannual meeting with no discussion. The Missions team will work with the church to see that they are brought into a proper relationship with the Association before any action is taken.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purpose of the Kershaw Baptist Association is to serve its member churches. The Association is a family of autonomous churches in a voluntary partnership, uniquely joined together to follow God's leadership for carrying out the full scope of the Great Commission. The Association shall endeavor to: build fellowship among the churches thus resulting in teamwork and unity; provide leadership development opportunities which will enable the churches and their staff to be effective in their ministry; help churches discover immediate needs within their community and determine how those needs can be met; engage in cooperative mission efforts which exceed the capabilities of any one church alone: discover, enlist, and deploy volunteers in mission service at home and abroad;

serve as an information and resource network; promote the work of the kingdom throughout the world in cooperation with other Baptist agencies.

ARTICLE IV - REPORTS FROM THE CHURCHES

The churches are expected to submit their Annual Church Profile to the Kershaw Baptist Association before the Fall Meeting, see Article 2 section G.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Finance Committee Chairperson, Personnel Committee Chairperson, Missions Committee Chairperson, Historian, Parliamentarian, three Trustees, WMU Director, and other ministry leaders as needed. They shall be elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting of the Association. The Nominating Committee shall present a nominee for each office. Other nominations are in order from the floor. These officers shall be elected by majority vote of those present and voting. Their term of office shall be one-year beginning upon their election at the July Executive Committee Meeting. The Moderator may not be elected to more than two consecutive terms. The Trustees shall serve terms of three years unless otherwise specified at the time of their election. No Trustee shall be eligible to succeed himself until one year has elapsed. All officers shall be members of churches cooperating with the Association. Officers may be removed by a 2/3 vote at any Executive Committee or Bi-Annual Meeting for cause.

ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

The duties of Associational officers shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Association, Director of Missions, pastors of cooperating churches, and two additional members elected by each church. The officers of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee shall transact the business of the association during the interim between annual meetings. It shall meet two times annually, once in January and once in July, as set forth in the Calendar of Activities or by call of the Moderator if found necessary. The members present shall constitute a quorum, with notice having been given of the meeting. The Committee shall report its actions to the Fall Meeting of the Association by the minutes of the Clerk. The moderator may call special meetings of the Executive Committee as he may deem necessary, with written notice being sent to members ten days prior to the meeting and such notices informing members of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

The Association shall have the Standing committees listed below along with any other committee authorized by the Association and each member will serve a three year term except the Nominating Committee as it is a one year term. The Director of Missions and Moderator will serve as ex-officio members of all Associational Committees.

A. Nominating Committee

- B. Program Committee
- C. Finance Committee
- D. Constitution and Bylaws Committee
- E. Missions Committee
- F. Enrollment Committee
- G. Personnel Committee
- H. Christian/Life Committee
- I. Ordination Committee

ARTICLE IX - ADMINISTRATION

The Director of Missions and other employees of the Association shall be charged with responsibility of the promotion of the whole program of the Association and Denomination. They shall work under the direction of and in cooperation with the Personnel Committee. They shall be nominated by the Personnel Committee of the Association, and elected by the Association at any Biannual Session, or by the Executive Committee if the next Biannual Session of the Association is thirty (30) days or more beyond the date on which the employees are nominated.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

BYLAWS

The work of the Association shall be governed by the following Bylaws.

ARTICLE I - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section A. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the Bi-Annual and Executive Committee Meetings. This person shall see that order and decorum are observed by all messengers.

Section B. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Moderator to preside in the absence, or upon the request of the Moderator. This officer shall assist the Moderator in the carrying out of his duties to the best interest of the Association. The Vice-Moderator shall accede to the office of Moderator should that office become vacant.

Section C. The clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, publish and distribute the Annual Minutes, and perform such other duties as the interest of the Association may require. Further, the clerk shall keep the minutes of the Executive Committee meetings and report same to the Biannual Meeting of the Association. For this service, the clerk shall receive all necessary expenses and remuneration as stipulated in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section D. The Treasurer shall be responsible for presenting the financial report of the Association to the executive committee and at the annual and bi-annual associational meetings. The Treasurer serves as ex-officio member of the Finance Committee. The treasurer cannot be an

employee of the association.

Section E. The Historian shall record important things that happen during the year. The historian shall also keep on file articles and items of interest relating to the churches of the Association. The Historian shall be reimbursed for all expenses incurred in the execution of his duties as provided for in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section F. The Parliamentarian is an advisor to the Moderator and shall, upon the Moderator's request, render to the Moderator and/or Association whatever service is needed.

Section G. There shall be three trustees who shall hold title to all property of the Association, whether real or otherwise, and shall execute such transfers of title, or signature, only as authorized by the Association. They shall be responsible for the upkeep of Associational property.

Section H. All other ministry leaders shall promote and supervise their programs in the Association in cooperation with the administrative staff.

ARTICLE II - COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

The Moderator and Director of Missions at the Spring Meeting shall appoint five persons to comprise the Nominating Committee to report at the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all Kershaw Baptist Association officers, committees, and ministry leaders. Nominations from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the elected leaders serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Nominations for vacancies occurring between business sessions may be presented at any Biannual or Executive Committee for election.

Section A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE, consisting of five (5) persons appointed by the Moderator and Director of Missions, shall report to the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all associational officers, ministry leaders, and other committees. Nominations from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the Committee members serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Persons to fill vacancies occurring between business sessions may be presented for election by the Executive Committee.

Section B. PROGRAM COMMITTEE, consisting of six (6) members (Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Associational Music Director and three members selected by the nominating committee), shall prepare the Program for the Biannual Sessions. The suggested program shall be presented in printed form to the Association at the beginning of the session for action. They shall recommend to the Association at the Bi-Annual Meeting: the time, place, speaker, and alternate for the next Bi-Annual Meeting. They shall plan for our beloved dead a memorial service to be conducted during the Fall Bi-Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section C. FINANCE COMMITTEE, consists of five (5) members along with the Treasurer of the Association. It will follow the Financial Policies and Procedures Handbook which may be updated by the Association as needed. In addition to these policies the finance committee will have the responsibility of preparing and presenting a recommended budget to the Association in its Fall Meeting and for the distribution of all the Associational Funds. The Committee shall send the proposed budget to the senior pastor of each church in the association two weeks prior to the biannual meeting. The senior pastor has the responsibility to provide copies of the budget to the messengers from his church. The Committee shall encourage each church to contribute to the financial needs of the Association. Further, it shall be responsible for having the Associational

financial records audited or reviewed every three years.

They shall promote a program of stewardship education and development, encouraging participation in the world missions program by gifts through the cooperative program and other avenues of support.

Section D. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE, consisting of three (3) members and the associational parliamentarian(s), shall suggest changes to the Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules of Order deemed advisable, as well as receive, examine and make recommendations to the Association on proposed amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws.

Section E. MISSIONS COMMITTEE, consisting of seven (7) members (at least three (3) of these being pastors), shall work with the Associational Director of Missions in surveying and studying the missions' needs in the Associational territory - primary missions, institutional missions and every phase - making recommendations to the Executive Committee (or) Bi-annual meetings. They further have the responsibilities set forth in Article II and may act as the mediatorial body, when called upon to do so, when there is an actual or threatened breach of fellowship in some church. In no case shall the autonomy of the local church be infringed upon.

Section F. ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE, consisting of four (4) members with one of those being the Ministry Assistant of the Association, shall provide for, secure and maintain the record of messengers in attendance at the Biannual Meetings. Further, it shall be the duty of this Committee to investigate the credentials of any messenger that might be in question.

Section G. PERSONNEL COMMITTEE, shall consist of five members (at least three being pastors) to be appointed by the Nominating Committee and the Nominating Committee shall appoint the chairman of the Personnel Committee. This committee shall be responsible for all personnel and matters of the personnel of the association.

A. Employment

1. This committee shall have the responsibility of recruiting, interviewing, and recommending all staff to be called by the Association including the Director of Missions.
2. In order to be consistent in employment practices this committee shall use a written application form and establish procedures whereby references can be checked.
3. Following employment, this committee should assist in placing the new staff members on the job.
4. This committee shall receive and investigate reports of substandard performance by hired staff members and recommend action as deemed appropriate to the Executive Committee. A special-called business meeting of the Executive Committee may be called for such a purpose.

B. Salaries

1. This committee shall design a program of salary administration and make annual recommendations to the Finance Committee.
2. If a prospective staff member cannot be hired at the approved budgeted salary schedule, the committee may, in consultation with the Finance Committee, provide a recommendation which shall be brought before the Association for approval at a regular or called business meeting.

C. Employee Benefits

1. This committee shall recommend to the Association a program of employee benefits.
2. Eligibility for benefits shall be clearly stated as policy.

D. Job Description

1. The committee shall maintain current job descriptions for each paid position of the associational staff.
2. Each job description shall be reviewed annually and updated as appropriate.

E. Performance Review

1. The committee shall make sure all employees are aware of the standards of performance required by the association.
2. The personnel committee chairperson as well as a selected pastor will perform the annual evaluation of the Director of Missions.
3. The Director of Missions will be responsible for performing annual evaluations of all other associational staff.

Section H. CHRISTIAN LIFE/RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE, shall consist of three members to be appointed by the Nominating Committee. This committee shall prepare and submit to the association all resolutions which it deems appropriate for adoption. Proposed resolutions from individuals not members of this committee shall be submitted in writing to the committee chairperson no later than forty-five days prior to the biannual meeting. In the event of a national emergency or catastrophic event, the forty-five day period may be waived, provided that the committee has sufficient time to thoroughly review and compile the proposed resolutions prior to the printing of the Book of Reports. The committee shall report on all matters submitted to it by the association, with or without recommendation or amendments. It shall report on any critical moral and social issues in order to provide leadership for Christian action needed to meet those needs; help churches apply the gospel to all areas of life by mobilizing and equipping members of the churches to be on mission in regard to moral and ethical concerns; and assist local churches in broader cooperative efforts and emphases.

Section I. ORDINATION COMMITTEE shall consist of six pastors that are active or retired in the

association. Any church desiring to ordain a candidate to the ministry may seek the help and advice of this committee in the process of the ordination procedure.

ARTICLE III – AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

RULES OF ORDER

1. The Association shall meet biannually on the last Tuesday in April and October at such time as the Executive Committee shall decide.
2. All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. The messengers present at the Biannual Meetings and at all properly called meetings shall constitute a quorum. A majority shall be a quorum for all Committees.
4. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution, Bylaws, or special rules of order of the Association.
5. As defined in Robert's Rules of Order Ex-officio members have voting privileges except in matters personal to them such as salary decision or performance discussions.
6. All committees' reports and resolutions shall be submitted in writing.
7. These Rules of Order may be amended at any session by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

Minutes of the Executive Committee

January 19, 2016

The meeting was called to order by Ray Lowe, Moderator and pastor of Buffalo. Thirty-two members of the committee were present. Prayer was offered by Russ McDonald, pastor of Cornerstone.

Associational Missionary Report: Ron Underwood

He used a power point presentation to speak of the good things going on in the Association and called them “Partnering with a Purpose.”

Block Party Trailer Ministry:

He referred to the screen for pictures of the garage for storing inflatables and the Block Party Trailers.

Mission College

Among those attending Missions College were Terry Corder (Mt. Pisgah), John Corder (Hillcrest), Pat Young (Trinity), Maureen Kohn (Camden First), Dean Elliott (Cassatt), Ray Lowe (Buffalo) and Russ McDonald (Cornerstone). The group gave highlights of their training, and how this could become mandatory for partnering with other countries and areas within the US in the future. The training applies to any outreach or missions team and only costs \$200, including room and board. Pat Young presented an orality story that she had learned as a way to present the gospel to others.

Underwood continued the good things of the Association by speaking of home repair ministry. The goal is to have men’s groups from churches work with the repair needs.

D-Now:

Luke Tolbert promoted this upcoming event for youth. He said we can do more together than apart. We’re part of the church global, and we want to make it easy for every church to participate, regardless of size. We want to see our young people grow. Justin Orr will be the speaker. The River Church Praise Band will lead worship. The event is happening at Camden First. The cost is only \$20 and covers lunch and dinner Saturday, guide, and T-shirt. There will be group sessions followed by small group sessions. Participating churches will provide small group leaders. Students stay in host homes on Friday night. Encouraged everyone to be involved in some way, saying that we have an opportunity to really do something Christ.

Mission Trips:

Senior Adult Mission Trip to Lynch, Kentucky is April 25-29. Interest meeting is January 25.

Mentioned some of our churches taking mission trips this year: Hermitage, Faith, Hillcrest, Camden First, and Springvale. Making big plans this year and will have an interest meeting next Thursday for anyone who may be interested in connecting one or more trips.

Healthy Pastors:

Underwood plans to focus more on pastors through monthly fellowships, quarterly training, Band of Brothers, a pastor/wife retreat, and Leadership Tract training.

Strategic Plan:

Underwood said the vision must come from the Associational Missionary. We should develop a needs-based ministry looking to the demographics. Simple doesn't necessarily mean easy. Missions begins at home.

The Big Rocks:

Healthy churches need to help our struggling churches. Churches working with one another in ministries they cannot accomplish alone. We must have missional outposts – unreached people groups, multi-housing, institutional settings, especially schools and connecting churches to schools. We need to look at starting new churches. We are looking west of Wateree River as a possibility for a plant. Sacks of Love partnering churches should not weary in doing good for the children.

National Partnerships:

Though we are identifying some closer locations, we will continue our partnerships with Metro New York and Cleveland.

Cuba Vision Tour 2015:

Chuck Everett (Trinity), Steve Lee (Mt. Olivet), and Ron Underwood went to Cuba to get a vision of the possibilities for our involvement. Everett talked of their trip saying this was one of the poorest areas he has ever seen. Churches cannot build new buildings. Plans are being made for two or three trips in the coming year – no big teams and no construction teams because the nationals need to work. We should not take their paying jobs from them. One possibility is trying to work a conference on spousal and child abuse. Another is a recovery program for alcoholics. If we vote to adopt Cuba, we hope to bring Pastor Orlando and a translator to a future meeting.

Underwood added that we don't have all the answers, but we will put together a strategy. Strategy will be to purchase Bibles to send now, implement 50 days of prayer for Cuba, have each associational church adopt a Cuban church. We are awaiting clarification from the International Mission Board for projects.

Rita Roberts (Buffalo), member of the International Missions Team, made the following motion:

“That Kershaw Baptist Association form a partnership to advance the work in Cuba for three years, then re-evaluate.”

The motion passed unanimously.

Finance:

Jason Fletcher (Hermitage), Finance Chairman, expressed appreciation to the churches for their support of the association in 2015. The budget was \$164,160 and contributions for the year were \$174,466. The budget for 2016 follows the vision set forth by the association. A motion was made to approve the reports as printed. The motion passed.

Other Business:

Ken Jackson (Hillcrest), Baseball Clinic Director, mentioned the baseball clinic that will be held March 5.

Jason Fletcher (Hermitage), Board member of Midlands Women's Center, reported that the center purchased an ultrasound machine and are in the process of being approved by DHEC. To be able to offer ultrasound, the

center will be operating on a shoestring budget. Sponsors are needed. Underwood agreed and said he believes in right to life and encouraged churches to be involved.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.

Minutes of the Spring Meeting
May 5, 2016

The Spring meeting of the Kershaw Baptist Association (KBA) was held at DeKalb Baptist Church, Camden S.C. on May 5, 2016. Following a musical prelude by Rev. Mark Hopkins (Hermitage), Rev. Keith Coates, pastor of the host church welcomed 57 messengers and 31 guests. Rev. Jeremy Ussery (Timrod) read scripture from Jeremiah 31:15 and Luke 18:16. Rev. Steven Pace (Bethune) led us in prayer.

Jason Hawes and the children's chorus from Baron DeKalb Elementary presented special music.

Rev. Ray Lowe (Buffalo), moderator, called the meeting to order. Minutes were presented and approved as written. Lowe noted the printed reports from committees and ministries were in the program and could be read at their convenience.

Molly Spearman, South Carolina State Superintendent was introduced by Ron Underwood, Associational Missionary. Mrs. Spearman received a B.A. in Music Education from Lander College a Masters of Arts in Education Supervision from George Washington University and an Education Specialist Degree from the University of South Carolina. For over 18 years, she served as a classroom music teacher and an assistant principal. She was elected to four terms as a member of the S.C. House of Representatives.

Growing up on a farm and graduating from a rural high school, she learned the importance of hard work and an appreciation of the skill set needed for a successful career. Her vision for South Carolina is that every student will be prepared for success upon graduation. She questioned "what is prepared"? Not just content knowledge, but "common sense" skills and characteristics. She emphasized that teachers could not do this alone, but stated that she wanted and needed our help.

Several things that could be done are:

1. If you're not allowed to talk about Jesus, just act like Jesus.
2. Pray for teachers, children and parents
3. Volunteer; schools must have something meaningful for the volunteers to do.
4. Be mentors

Yolande Anderson, Family & Community Engagement director also stated that support and help is needed in our schools. Some of the projects that she helps with are:

1. Back Pack program
2. Summer feeding programs
3. Teacher support
 - a. Feed a family
 - b. Reading buddy
 - c. Provide supplies
4. Use technology to keep parents informed
5. Be committed

Dr. Frank Morgan, Superintendent of Kershaw County School District (KCSD) was recognized and thanked for his leadership in our local schools. He thanked the KBA for its participation in the Sack of Love program.

The Kershaw Baptist Association submitted a project request to the South Carolina Baptist Convention and received a check in the amount of \$2300.00 to host a back-to-school "Thank You" luncheon for all KCSD teachers and staff on August 9, 2016. This is one of the efforts to connect the churches of Kershaw Baptist Association to our schools for Christ.

New Ministers: Rev. Underwood recognized three ministers who have taken on the leadership role in our churches. Gene Stokes, pastor, Emmanuel Baptist Church, Jeremy Ussery, pastor, Timrod Baptist Church and Jimmy Thompson, associate minister, DeKalb Baptist Church.

Nominating Committee: Rev. Ray Lowe announced the names of the new Nominating Committee members. According to the Constitution and Bylaws, the members are appointed by the Associational Missionary and the Moderator. The members are Rev. John Corder, Hillcrest, Rev. Everett Reconnu, Southside, Rev. Jeremy Ussery, Timrod, Fred Stephens, Bethune, Robert and Paulette Munn, Camden First Baptist and Genie Wallace, Cedar Creek.

Financial Report: Rev. Lowe referred everyone to the financial report and should there be any questions, please contact the Kershaw Baptist Association office.

Associational Missionary Report: Ron Underwood stated that it had been a pleasure to serve the churches and to serve **with** the churches in the Kershaw Baptist Association.

He stated that currently the Association had 3 churches without pastors and that these churches were bi-vocational positions. This is phenomenal based on the size of our Association. Pastors are doing well and churches are healthy. He thanked the churches for taking care of the pastors so faithfully.

He reported that the D-Now weekend was a success.

The KBA will be assessing the Baseball Clinic and Track Meet. The numbers have been decreasing, but awards were given out and invitations offered. Underwood spoke of a young lady who came to the fence and knelt in prayer and accepted Christ. He confirmed that "that's what it's all about". Those activities are still yielding spiritual fruit.

A group attended the Carolina Cup along with campus ministers and Christian college students from around the state, letting other students know of a better life with Christ. The KBA will be working with the state convention and campus ministries to have more of a presence at the Carolina Cup in the future.

The next week, a KBA team was at "Dog Fest" at Camden High School. There were numerous softball games and the inflatables were used, letting the kids play. Contacts were made with the parents. KBA demonstrated presence within the community, showing love in the name of Jesus. Underwood encouraged more of this participation within the schools and neighborhoods.

He reported on the group that had recently returned from a mission trip to Lynch, Kentucky. He thanked each for their great work.

Ron Underwood & Ray Lowe had recently gone on the Atlanta Vision tour. Several new churches are being planted and since the travel time is minimal, he suggested that if any church did not have mission plans for the Summer, he would be glad to talk to anyone about some of the needs there and how the churches could be faithful to the Great Commission.

The National Day of Prayer was attended, praying for our country, its leaders, businesses, schools and the military. These prayers have such an impact on lives.

Band of Brothers is going great. He asked the pastors not to give up, but join the support group.

Underwood reported that the KBA now has two trailers and five inflatables. He stated they were great for Vacation Bible School and block parties.

Some upcoming events were three pastors preparing for a second trip to Cuba. Numerous churches are going on summer mission trips to Cleveland, New Jersey, Pittsburgh, Lynch,

Atlanta and New York. Ron and Paulette Underwood will be leading three churches to Gatlinburg to work resort ministries. He praised the churches for their desire to do mission work.

Pastors would be hearing more about the Leadership Track, a South Carolina Baptist Convention effort for pastors to continually develop stronger leadership skills, especially in leading their churches through God-inspired changes in a healthy way. So often, churches go through troubled times and the pastor will say "I don't know how to respond to that." This leadership will pass on some good proven skills.

Underwood shared the following challenges:

1. Cuba Partnership – If you feel inclined to join in a partnership, please let him know.
2. Trips to New York mission fading, primarily due to distance, but there is always a mission field close by. Call him for any details.
3. Encourage participation in Bible drills.
4. 2016 Cola Wars led by Camden First. It's a fun experience for all middle and high school students, high energy and Christ-exalting. Each night was filled with dynamic speakers and worship.
5. He noted there were baby bottles out in the foyer with the idea to pass out and ask that the bottles be filled with change/cash. The Midlands Women's Center, a crisis pregnancy center in Kershaw County is dedicated to meeting the spiritual, emotional and physical needs of women in unplanned pregnancy situations. The cash collected will help keep the services available.
6. Mildred Smith offering will be used in connecting churches with schools to help with the cost of the "Thank you" luncheon.

The benediction was offered by Rev. Steve Lee.

Executive Committee Meeting
July 19, 2016**

The Executive Committee meeting of the Kershaw Baptist Association was held at the KBA office

July 19, 2016. The meeting was called to order by Rev. Ray Lowe, Moderator, and Rev. Russ McDonald, led in prayer.

Rev. Doug Huntsinger, pastor of Lugoff First Baptist, offered a special prayer for our nation, our military, evangelism in other countries and that ALL would stand up for Christ.

The minutes from the Spring Meeting were presented and approved as written.

Financial Report: Rev. Lowe referred everyone to the financial report for information. Treasurer Wanda Davis was present should there have been any questions.

Nominating Committee Report: Rev. Everett Reconnu presented the Nominating Committee's report for the leadership roles in the Kershaw Baptist Association and a roster of officers were attached to the handout. The officers were approved as presented.

There were no other reports from committees or officers.

Cuban Mission Trip: Rev. Dean Elliott of Cassatt Baptist Church gave a slide presentation and report from the recent Cuba Mission trip. The mission team consisted of Rev. Dean Elliott, Rev. Steve Lee and Rev. Jerry Gardner. They returned with a clearer vision of how God is leading the KBA in this missions partnership. Elliott expressed his gratitude for the opportunity that they were able to go and witness for the Lord. He stated that the government will not allow new churches to be built, but the church buildings that were there when Castro came into power can be repaired and rebuilt. They cannot construct new churches but are not restricted to building onto their homes (such as a garage or carport) and allowed to hold church services in their homes. Elliott explained that the Cuban people have the laborers to help with construction, but they biggest issue was funding. Even the simplest things like bicycles, toilet seats, and refrigerators are appreciated. They covet our prayers and request that more teams will come to share a witness with them.

Other Mission trips: Several churches have been to Gatlinburg TN, Lynch KY and Atlanta, GA, providing school supplies, hosting day camps for children and family programs in the evening. Other planned trips include New York, New Jersey, Pittsburgh, and Cleveland. International trips to Peru and Guatemala are also planned. Ron Underwood remarked that he had never seen an association so missions-minded like the Kershaw Association.

Associational Missionary Report: Ron Underwood

Underwood has recently returned from a Vision Trip to Atlanta. They have 140 church planters, 40 – 50 already establishing home churches, much like those in Cuba. Others are looking for places to establish churches. The planters are trying to reach the lost in Atlanta.

The National Day of Prayer was well attended. The director of the S.C. Baptist Convention spoke and had a great service.

On September 30, the Association will be leading a prayer vigil on the lawn of the Kershaw County Courthouse 40 days before the election. Underwood said that he knew we all were praying for the election and know that if God does not help us, we're in great trouble as a nation. Many blessings would be received if every believer dedicated themselves to prayer for those 40 days.

He informed those present that after much prayer Cornerstone has decided to shut its doors. He thanked Rev. Russ McDonald and his wife, Linda for their patience during this time. Another church in the Lugoff area (not an official Baptist church) has started using the building. Services are being held but not in the way Associational Missionary Underwood was hoping or praying for.

God has been at work; a new church, Crossway Baptist pastored by Dr. Bruce Watford has asked to join the Association and the process has begun. He praised Crossway for the ministry started in the area apartments.

Since the Spring meeting, one of the Association's purposes is to connect our churches to the schools in a greater way. Underwood stated the churches were already doing this through the Sack of Love program and other activities, but wanted to show the school district how the Association loves and cares for them even more. The Association took on a huge task of providing a "thank you" luncheon for all Kershaw County School District teachers and staff on August 9. Not only a thank you, but to show the love of Christ to all in attendance. He asked for churches to provide homemade desserts and volunteers for serving.

The Association will sponsor a "Back 2 School" party at the lake on August 14. If youth leaders need more information, please contact the associational office.

Another great emphasis is the Home Repair ministry. He would like to have a monthly project. In particular, the Association needs men, women and youth groups willing to help with home repairs near their home church.

Underwood spoke about the Leadership track for pastors. We currently have approximately 12 pastors doing some training over several months learning how to be a

stronger leader in their church. The Leadership track is an effort by the S.C. Baptist Convention designed to develop stronger leadership skills, especially in leading their church through God-inspired changes in a healthy way.

Two churches are currently without pastors, Refuge and Beaverdam. Undewood is working diligently with the search committees to locate a man called by God for their field.

The Constitution and Bylaws committee is preparing to update the bylaws. If you have any suggestions and/or any concerns, please call the mission center.

Underwood asked for nominees across the association to serve on the nominating committee for the S.C. Baptist Convention. They need 2 pastors and 2 lay persons to serve a 3 year term, meeting twice a year.

Miscellaneous Business:

The WMU Fall training meeting will be August 11 at Springvale Baptist, Lugoff.

Dr. Bruce Watford stated that Crossway Baptist will be sponsoring a scholarship for teachers and encouraged other churches to "connect" with our schools in the same manner.

Rev Cotton Pate, pastor of Frontline Biker church invited all churches to a prayer vigil held for Law Enforcement at the market area across from City Hall in Kershaw on July 26.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned with prayer by Rev. Dean Elliott.

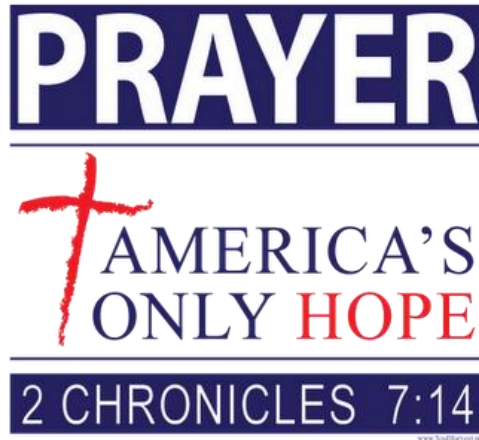

Rev. Underwood also recognized the Luke Morrison Family. The Morrisons are leaving Shamrock Church, where he is pastor, to accept God's call to be a North American Missionary in Atlanta.

Rev. Underwood presented his vision for summer 2017.

Our Uttermost Part of the Earth

During the “Unto the Uttermost,” international missions, Rev. Underwood recognized churches that went on international mission trips in 2016: Camden First, Cedar Creek, Cassatt, Faith, Malvern Hill, Mt. Olivet, Shamrock, and Timrod.

Rev. Dean Elliott (Cassatt) and Rev. Steve Lee (Mt. Olivet) presented a report on their recent Cuba mission trip.
