CONSTITUTION, BY-LAWS AND RULES OF ORDER

CONSTITUTION

Preamble: We, the messengers of the Kershaw Baptist Association, from the churches of the Southern Baptist Convention of Kershaw County, South Carolina, and adjacent areas, do hereby agree to certain fundamental principles, which amended from time to time are as follows:

ARTICLE I – NAME

This body shall be known as "The Kershaw Baptist Association."

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION

- A. Membership in this body shall be confined to churches which conform to the New Testament doctrines of faith and practice as described in the Baptist Faith and Message (2000) and which cooperate with and financially support the association, the South Carolina Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention.
- B. This Association shall be composed of messengers chosen by each church cooperating with the Association. Each church shall be entitled to two messengers and to one additional messenger for each fifty members or fraction thereof with a maximum representation of fifteen (15) messengers from any one church. (Director of Missions and officers do not count against the quota of the churches of which they are members.) The DOM and officers referred to in Article V shall be messengers by virtue of the office held.
- C. Churches desiring to affiliate with the Kershaw Baptist Association shall submit a written request for membership to the Missions Committee as least thirty (30) days before a biannual Executive Meeting. The Missions Committee shall make a thorough investigation of the petitioning church as to its doctrine, practices, and support of the total program of work and shall report on the petition at the biannual session of the Association, recommending one of the following courses of action:
 - 1. Acceptance of the church into the Kershaw Baptist Association
 - 2. Rejection of the petition or
 - 3. Watchcare, to allow for additional study

The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee. Unless the Missions Committee recommends that a church's request be rejected, all petitioning

churches will be received under watchcare for their first year. Watchcare will be under supervision of the Missions Committee.

- D. Watchcare churches will:
 - 1. Provide a copy of the Constitution and By-laws, current leadership roster and document of incorporation by the state, if incorporated.
 - 2. Complete and return the Annual Church Profile.
 - 3. Begin or continue missions giving through the Association.
 - 4. Fulfill any additional prerequisites specified by the Missions Team.

When churches have fulfilled the responsibilities of their watchcare year, the Missions Committee will recommend that their watchcare period be approved as completed. Such approval will normally come in the Biannual Meeting the year after the watchcare begins. Should any of the above responsibilities lack completion or any significant issue need resolution, the recommendation to prolong the watchcare status will be brought to the Executive Committee.

- E. Waiving the Watchcare. The watchcare year may be waived for a church which is transferring from another association. This church must come from a neighboring association and be transferring with a good report from that association. They also must fulfill the four obligations listed above. The Executive Committee will then discuss and vote on the recommendation and then be voted on without discussion at the next biannual Associational Meeting. A majority vote of those present and voting shall sustain the actions recommended by the Missions Committee.
- F. Withdrawal of member churches from the Kershaw Baptist Association may be accomplished by written statement to the association.
- G. Dismissal of a church may be recommended by the Missions Committee for those who are not conforming to section A or who does not turn in their ACP Report for a period of three (3) consecutive years. This motion would be brought up at an Executive Committee for discussion and vote and if the motion is approved for dismissal, then the church would be brought to a vote for dismissal at a biannual meeting with no discussion. The Missions team will work with the church to see that they are brought into a proper relationship with the Association before any action is taken.

ARTICLE III – PURPOSE

The purpose of the Kershaw Baptist Association is to serve its member churches. The Association is a family of autonomous churches in a voluntary partnership, uniquely joined together to follow God's leadership for carrying out the full scope of the Great Commission.

The Association shall endeavor to: build fellowship among the churches thus resulting in teamwork and unity; provide leadership development opportunities which will enable the churches and their staff to be effective in their ministry; help churches discover immediate needs within their community and determine how

those needs can be met; engage in cooperative mission efforts which exceed the capabilities of any one church alone: discover, enlist, and deploy volunteers in mission service at home and abroad; serve as an information and resource network; promote the work of the kingdom throughout the world in cooperation with other Baptist agencies.

ARTICLE IV - REPORTS FROM THE CHURCHES

The churches are expected to submit their Annual Church Profile to the Kershaw Baptist Association before the Fall Meeting, see Article 2 section G.

ARTICLE V - OFFICERS

The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Finance Committee Chairperson, Personnel Committee Chairperson, Missions Committee Chairperson, Historian, Parliamentarian, three Trustees, WMU Director, and other ministry leaders as needed. They shall be elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting of the Association. The Nominating Committee shall present a nominee for each office. Other nominations are in order from the floor. These officers shall be elected by majority vote of those present and voting. Their term of office shall

be one-year beginning upon their election at the July Executive Committee Meeting. The Moderator may not be elected to more than two consecutive terms. The Trustees shall serve terms of three years unless otherwise specified at the time of their election. No Trustee shall be eligible to succeed himself until one year has elapsed. All officers shall be members of churches cooperating with the Association. Officers may be removed by a 2/3 vote at any Executive Committee or Bi-Annual Meeting for cause.

ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

The duties of Associational officers shall be as set forth in the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII - EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall consist of the officers of the Association, Director of Missions, pastors of cooperating churches, and two additional members elected by each church. The officers of the Association shall be the officers of the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee shall transact the business of the association during the interim between annual meetings. It shall meet two times annually, once in January and once in July, as set forth in the Calendar of Activities or by call of the Moderator if found necessary. The members present shall constitute a quorum, with notice having been given of the meeting. The Committee shall report its actions to the Fall Meeting of the Association by the minutes of the Clerk. The moderator may call special meetings of the Executive Committee as he may deem necessary, with written notice being sent to members ten days prior to the meeting and such notices informing members of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting.

ARTICLE VIII - COMMITTEES

The Association shall have the Standing committees listed below along with any other committee authorized by the Association and each member will serve a three year term except the Nominating Committee as it is a one year term. The Director of Missions and Moderator will serve as ex-officio members of all Associational Committees.

- A. Nominating Committee
- B. Program Committee
- C. Finance Committee
- D. Constitution and Bylaws Committee
- E. Missions Committee
- F. Enrollment Committee
- G. Personnel Committee
- H. Christian/Life Committee
- I. Ordination Committee

ARTICLE IX - ADMINISTRATION

The Director of Missions and other employees of the Association shall be charged with responsibility of the promotion of the whole program of the Association and Denomination. They shall work under the direction of and in cooperation with the Personnel Committee. They shall be nominated by the Personnel Committee of the Association, and elected by the Association at any Biannual Session, or by the Executive Committee if the next Biannual Session of the Association is thirty (30) days or more beyond the date on which the employees are nominated.

ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

BYLAWS

The work of the Association shall be governed by the following Bylaws.

ARTICLE I - DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section A. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside over the Bi-Annual and Executive Committee Meetings. This person shall see that order and decorum are observed by all messengers.

Section B. It shall be the duty of the Vice-Moderator to preside in the absence, or upon the request of the Moderator. This officer shall assist the Moderator in the carrying out of

his duties to the best interest of the Association. The Vice-Moderator shall accede to the office of Moderator should that office become vacant.

Section C. The clerk shall keep an accurate record of the proceedings of the Association, publish and distribute the Annual Minutes, and perform such other duties as the interest of the Association may require. Further, the clerk shall keep the minutes of the Executive Committee meetings and report same to the Biannual Meeting of the Association. For this service, the clerk shall receive all necessary expenses and remuneration as stipulated in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section D. The Treasurer shall be responsible for presenting the financial report of the Association to the executive committee and at the annual and bi-annual associational meetings. The Treasurer serves as ex-officio member of the Finance Committee. The treasurer cannot be an employee of the association.

Section E. The Historian shall record important things that happen during the year. The historian shall also keep on file articles and items of interest relating to the churches of the Association. The Historian shall be reimbursed for all expenses incurred in the execution of his duties as provided for in the Annual Budget of the Association.

Section F. The Parliamentarian is an advisor to the Moderator and shall, upon the Moderator's request, render to the Moderator and/or Association whatever service is needed.

Section G. There shall be three trustees who shall hold title to all property of the Association, whether real or otherwise, and shall execute such transfers of title, or signature, only as authorized by the Association. They shall be responsible for the upkeep of Associational property.

Section H. All other ministry leaders shall promote and supervise their programs in the Association in cooperation with the administrative staff.

ARTICLE II - COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES

The Moderator and Director of Missions at the Spring Meeting shall appoint five persons to comprise the Nominating Committee to report at the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all Kershaw Baptist Association officers, committees, and ministry leaders. Nominations

from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the elected leaders serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Nominations for vacancies

occurring between business sessions may be presented at any Biannual or Executive Committee for election.

Section A. NOMINATING COMMITTEE, consisting of five (5) persons appointed by the Moderator and Director of Missions, shall report to the July Executive Committee Meeting a list of nominees for all associational officers, ministry leaders, and other committees. Nominations from the floor shall be in order, after which elections shall be held with the Committee members serving until their successors are elected at the July Executive Committee Meeting. Persons to fill vacancies occurring between business sessions may be presented for election by the Executive Committee.

Section B. PROGRAM COMMITTEE, consisting of six (6) members (Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Associational Music Director and three members selected by the nominating committee), shall prepare the Program for the Biannual Sessions. The suggested program shall be presented in printed form to the Association at the beginning of the session for action. They shall recommend to the Association at the Bi-Annual Meeting: the time, place, speaker, and alternate for the next Bi-Annual Meeting. They shall plan for our beloved dead a memorial service to be conducted during the

Fall Bi-Annual Meeting of the Association.

Section C. FINANCE COMMITTEE, consists of five (5) members along with the Treasurer of the Association. It will follow the Financial Policies and Procedures Handbook which may be updated by the Association as needed. In addition to these policies the finance committee will have the responsibility of preparing and presenting a recommended budget to the Association in its Fall Meeting and for the distribution of all the Associational Funds. The Committee shall send the proposed budget to the senior pastor of each church in the association two weeks prior to the biannual meeting. The senior pastor has the responsibility to provide copies of the budget to the messengers from his church. The Committee shall encourage each church to contribute to the

financial needs of the Association. Further, it shall be responsible for having the Associational financial records audited or reviewed every three years.

They shall promote a program of stewardship education and development, encouraging participation in the world missions program by gifts through the cooperative program and other avenues of support.

Section D. CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS COMMITTEE, consisting of three (3) members and the associational parliamentarian(s), shall suggest changes to the Constitution, Bylaws, and Rules of Order deemed advisable, as well as receive, examine and make recommendations to the Association on proposed amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws.

Section E. MISSIONS COMMITTEE, consisting of seven (7) members (at least three (3) of these being pastors), shall work with the Associational Director of Missions in surveying and studying the missions' needs in the Associational territory - primary missions, institutional missions and every phase - making recommendations to the Executive Committee (or) Biannual meetings. They further have the responsibilities set forth in Article II and may act as the mediatorial body, when called upon to do so, when there is an actual or threatened breach of fellowship in some church. In no case shall the autonomy of the local church be infringed upon.

Section F. ENROLLMENT COMMITTEE, consisting of four (4) members with one of those being the Ministry Assistant of the Association, shall provide for, secure and maintain the record of messengers in attendance at the Biannual Meetings. Further, it shall be the duty of this Committee to investigate the credentials of any messenger that might be in question.

Section G. PERSONNEL COMMITTEE, shall consist of five members (at least three being pastors) to be appointed by the Nominating Committee and the Nominating Committee shall appoint the chairman of the Personnel Committee. This committee shall be responsible

for all personnel and matters of the personnel of the association.

A. Employment

- 1. This committee shall have the responsibility of recruiting, interviewing, and recommending all staff to be called by the Association including the Director of Missions.
- 2. In order to be consistent in employment practices this committee shall use a written application form and establish procedures whereby references can be checked.
- 3. Following employment, this committee should assist in placing the new staff members on the job.
- 4. This committee shall receive and investigate reports of substandard performance by hired staff members and recommend action as deemed appropriate to the Executive Committee. A special-called business meeting of the Executive Committee may be called for such a purpose.

B. Salaries

- 1. This committee shall design a program of salary administration and make annual recommendations to the Finance Committee.
- 2. If a prospective staff member cannot be hired at the approved budgeted salary schedule, the committee may, in consultation with the Finance Committee, provide a recommendation which shall be brought before the Association for approval at a regular or called business meeting.

C. Employee Benefits

- 1. This committee shall recommend to the Association a program of employee benefits.
- 2. Eligibility for benefits shall be clearly stated as policy.

D. Job Description

- 1. The committee shall maintain current job descriptions for each paid position of the associational staff.
- 2. Each job description shall be reviewed annually and updated as appropriate.

E. Performance Review

- 1. The committee shall make sure all employees are aware of the standards of performance required by the association.
- 2. The personnel committee chairperson as well as a selected pastor will perform the annual evaluation of the Director of Missions.
- 3. The Director of Missions will be responsible for performing annual evaluations of all other associational staff.

Section H. CHRISTIAN LIFE/RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE, shall consist of three members to be appointed by the Nominating Committee. This committee shall prepare and submit to the association all resolutions which it deems appropriate for adoption. Proposed resolutions from individuals not members of this committee shall be submitted in writing to the committee chairperson no later than forty-five days prior to the biannual meeting. In the event of a national emergency or catastrophic event, the forty-five day period may be waived, provided that the committee has sufficient time to thoroughly review and compile the proposed resolutions prior to the printing of the

Book of Reports. The committee shall report on all matters submitted to it by the association, with or without recommendation or amendments. It shall report on any critical moral and social issues in order to provide leadership for Christian action needed to meet those needs; help churches apply the gospel to all areas of life by mobilizing and equipping members of the churches to be on mission in regard to moral and ethical concerns; and assist local churches in broader cooperative efforts and emphases.

Section I. ORDINATION COMMITTEE shall consist of six pastors that are active or retired in the association. Any church desiring to ordain a candidate to the ministry may seek the help and advice of this committee in the process of the ordination procedure.

ARTICLE III – AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended at any Biannual Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting. A proposed amendment shall be presented in writing to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee for clarification and correlation and a copy provided to all the churches of the association at least sixty (60) days before the Biannual Meeting at which time it shall be voted on.

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. The Association shall meet biannually on the last Tuesday in April and October at such time as the Executive Committee shall decide.
- 2. All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. The messengers present at the Biannual Meetings and at all properly called meetings shall constitute a quorum. A majority shall be a quorum for all Committees.

- 4. The rules contained in Robert's Rules of Order shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable, and in which they are not inconsistent with the Constitution, Bylaws, or special rules of order of the Association.
- 5. As defined in Robert's Rules of Order Ex-officio members have voting privileges except in matters personal to them such as salary decision or performance discussions.
- 6. All committees' reports and resolutions shall be submitted in writing.
- 7. These Rules of Order may be amended at any session by a majority of the messengers present and voting.

Kershaw Baptist Association Executive Committee Meeting July 18, 2017

The Executive Committee meeting of the Kershaw Baptist Association was held at the KBA Mission Center on July 18, 2017 with 23 messengers in attendance. The meeting was called to order by Rev. Ray Lowe, Moderator and Steve Lee led in prayer.

The minutes from the Spring Meeting were presented and approved as written.

Financial Report: The financial report was presented and a copy was included in the meeting's agenda packet.

Nominating Committee Report: Rev. Adam Whiteside presented the Nominating Committee's report for the leadership roles in the Kershaw Baptist Association and a roster of officers was attached to the handout. The officers were approved as presented.

There were no other reports from committees or officers.

National Mission Trips: Several churches have been busy doing God's work in Myrtle Beach, Cleveland, Atlanta and Kentucky providing school supplies, hosting day camps for children and family programs in the evening.

International Mission Trips: Rev. Steve Lee, Rev. Bryan Plyler and Rev. Todd Gandy reported on their recent trip to Cuba. It was their first working trip. Previous trips were to visit churches and seek out the needs. Rev. Lee was pleased to report that as of today, over half of their small needs have been met within thirty different churches. This is an ongoing process and the pastors in that area were very gracious. Approximately \$12,000 from the local Kershaw Baptist Association churches, non-KBA churches and individuals was used for the needs. Projects are displayed on the front table at the KBA. More projects will be displayed at the October Fall Meeting. Rev. Plyler reported they were able to invest in leaders with encouragement and gave gifts to the pastors and their wives. They stayed in a non-Christian Bed & Breakfast and were very excited that they could witness and minister to the other guests. His desire is to take a group of high school seniors and college aged students in the near future. Rev. Gandy stated that he realized how blessed we are and how humbling the Cuban people were. A simple gesture such as candy to a child was amazing. He stated the Spirit of God and the work of God is tremendous in these churches.

Associational Missionary Report: Rev. Ron Underwood encouraged all churches to "get out" to the communities, cities of our nation and countryside's of our world. The gospel is the hope of our world. He thanked the churches for their continued efforts in spreading the Word and encouraged all churches to send a group somewhere. He reported that in April, 12 churches were involved with the home repair blitz. There are still homes needing repairs, and he hoped that more could be accomplished in the near future.

Rev. Ron Underwood was pleased to say that finances were good and for the first time the KBA was able to provide assistance to churches that went on a national mission trip. The KBA wrote \$500 checks to the nine churches participating. One church held a sports camp. The KBA presented them with a \$1000 check for that huge local missions effort. For the individuals who went to Cuba, the KBA was able to give \$1000 for the leader and \$500 for each person that was able to go. For those who are not able to physically go, by giving to the ministry of the KBA, you ARE going. He thanked each for their faithfulness.

Rev. Underwood explained the purpose of the radio ministry. It's our evangelistic outreach through the local 102.7 FM radio station. It is aired Monday through Friday at 7:30 am and lasts 90 - 120 seconds. It's called "Time Out with God". Presently, Ron is doing the devotionals, but welcomes any pastor to join this ministry.

There is now a monthly opportunity to feed the homeless. KBA churches are joining up with the Love-Serve-Give ministry, United Way and other churches to feed the homeless and needy. Many churches have been involved, but now KBA has been given the fourth Sunday of every month to serve. This is a great opportunity for youth groups, senior groups or Sunday school groups to serve the homeless.

Businesses and organizations are holding a Back to School bash on Saturday, July 29. It is being held at the Camden City arena and one organizer said it would be great if they had inflatables. The KBA would be providing the obstacle course inflatable at this event from 8:00 to 12:00. This is a great witnessing tool, as last year over 1200 students attended. It will be a great opportunity to mix with community and speak with parents.

The Sportsman's Banquet is planned for Saturday, September 9. Bobby Richardson will be the guest speaker and lots of door prizes will be awarded. The BBQ dinner is free. The event is not just for church folks, but Ron wants you to bring your lost friends and family members. Men's ministry directors are encouraged to start praying, planning and preparing. Help will be needed with tables, chairs and most of all volunteers. Mrs. Vada Arant, KBA WMU director, will be working on having plenty of homemade desserts. Rev. Underwood reported that he and Kathy had been working on procuring grants from the State convention and as of today, notification was received that the KBA had been awarded a \$2500.00 grant for the Sportsman's Banquet.

Rev. Ron Underwood said that Kathy and the churches have been doing a great job with Sacks of Love for the past 8-9 years, serving over 400 children each week with the 19 participating schools. Everywhere across Kershaw County, people know about Sacks of Love. But it's time to step it up... we've been putting Sacks of Love out there, but some people don't know who it is from. Though it's done in the name of Jesus, the families may not know.

One of the great mission fields is our schools. Last year, the Kershaw Baptist Association provided the meal for the teachers' luncheon, but due to a conflict, the schools will not be meeting together for lunch. Dr. Frank Morgan's suggestion was to provide 10,000 pencils

and agreed to a Gospel message printed on each pencil. As students and teachers sharpen the pencils, they can see the encouraging message. The pencils will be presented to the schools on August 9. Ron thanked all for their giving to the Mildred Smith offering during the Week of Prayer for Associational Missions in May which helped with the cost of the pencils.

But more important than pencils are committees that have been working and establishing School Care Teams. Every church in our association needs to be partnered with another church as a "Care Team" for one of your local schools. The KBA will give each team \$150.00 to minister to the teachers the week before school starts. The Care Team will be meeting to talk, pray and plan.

A meeting is to be held July 25 at Wateree Baptist to finalize preparation for the prayer walk scheduled for Sunday, August 13, 3:00 – 7:00 pm. Ron is asking each church and their Care Team to prayer walk their school. He encouraged them not to sit in the sanctuary, but get out to the schools. A list of needs for the prayer walk was included in the handout, and the KBA will send materials to each pastor and WMU director that will be helpful in planning the prayer walk.

Several challenges presented were:

- 1. Churches without pastors are Laurel Hill, Lakeview, Bethune and First Baptist Camden.
- 2. Too many churches have plateaued or are declining. How are we willing to adjust or change to reach the next generations or the lost no matter the age?
- 3. Pray for God to come down in power so the lost world will take notes.

Miscellaneous business included the WMU training scheduled for August 10. Information is attached to the handout.



Kershaw Baptist Association Fall Meeting Minutes October 24, 2017

The Fall meeting of the Kershaw Baptist Association was held at Cassatt Baptist Church on October 24, 2017. All present enjoyed a delicious meal of chili and baked potato bar and were asked to vote for their favorites.

Rev. Adam Whiteside led the invocation and the meeting was called to order by Rev. Ken Jackson.

Rev. Ron Underwood introduced some of our new church leaders:

Rev. Jim Goudelock (Interim Pastor – Lakeview)

Jamie Holcombe (Minister of Worship & Education – Hermitage)

Rev. Ken Newsome (Pastor of Music and Discipleship - Malvern Hill)

Allan Ogburn (Director of Children & Young – Trinity)

Rev. Jim Osteen (Transitional Pastor – Camden First)

Chris Beckham from Connie Maxwell Children's home stated that Connie Maxwell is celebrating its 125th year and in return, they wanted to recognize the top 125 churches in lifetime giving. Camden First Baptist was one of those named in the top 125.

The minutes from the Executive Meeting held July 18, 2017 were presented and approved as written.

Rev. Ron Underwood talked about the Strategic Vision of the Kershaw Baptist Association. The vision is to care for the pastors & their families, the health of our churches; making them stronger and evangelism whether it's personal or community wide. Also included in this vision are local missions, global missions and church planting/re-planting.

Rev. Taylor Wells and Sharon Kuzbary presented information on local mission activities. Activities include ESL classes, a presence at the Carolina Cup and home repair. One of the biggest goals the local mission's team worked at was taking the ministry into the local schools. Sacks of Love and the gift of 10,000 pencils with printed gospel messages helped strengthen this relationship.

Rev. Underwood reported that Disaster Relief teams had been busy the past months, responding to several "call outs" and are ready to go when needed. The radio ministry on 102.7 each morning at 7:30, Monday through Friday is a great opportunity of evangelism. Several pastors have been involved but more are welcome to join this evangelistic outreach.

Rev. Terry Corder presented the mission work completed on a National level. He praised the churches that have participated in National Mission trips and two partnerships over the last several years in Ohio and New York. The NAMB has identified 28 or more "send" cities as target areas because 80% of the population in the United States live in these cities. There is a lostness in those cities that is unreal and he urged all to reach out to everyone. Churches were recognized as serving on Summer mission trips in the following areas: Myrtle Beach, New York, Ohio, Alabama, Georgia, Kentucky, and Pennsylvania. He encouraged all to start praying about where your church might want to go next Summer.

International Mission trips: Rev. Steve Lee recognized the churches that participated in international mission trips. Countries served were Guatemala, Romania, Ireland, Ecuador, Central Asia & Cuba.

Rev. Ron Underwood reported that Cassatt Baptist Church is planning a trip to Cuba in March 2018. He encouraged everyone to start praying and support this ministry.

Rev. Doug Huntsinger presented the 2018 budget for consideration as presented in the handout. The budget was approved as presented.

Rev. Ron Underwood expressed the concern of the opioid crisis in our state and nation. One vision of our association is "what can we do for the individuals and families" effected by this epidemic. He stated that as Baptists we have maintained a distance there or kept our hands clean. He hopes that we can do a better job in reaching those families.

While serving a church in Pageland, Rev Ray Lowe was introduced to the Good Samaritan Colony in Ruby SC. It is a Christian residential rehab facility. Jason Love, Pastor/Director of Good Samaritan Colony reported that it was started in 1978. It is a free facility supported by churches, businesses and individuals who have been touched by drug and alcohol issues going on in our nation. Currently he has 8 men who are involved in Bible study and counseling. He requests prayer & support from all who feel led to help in this ministry. A "needs" list was provided.

Teen Challenge is a faith-based organization which operates on the generous gifts of friends, church mission support and business sponsorship. The facility is a fully operational Induction Center, offering the first four to six months of the program for young men who have become addicted to alcohol and drugs. Pastor Wayne reported that between 180-200 people are being lost weekly in South Carolina to overdose. One of his main objectives is to immerse the men into the Word of God and grow spiritually. The organization is continuing to provide programs for teens as well as adults, both male & female. A range of services can extend up to 14 months, where the students receive help in educational needs, career direction and spiritual life in Christ.

Locally, Jimmy Braddock leads the "Celebrate Recovery Crisis", a 12 step ministry at Bethel Worship Center.

Dr. Nic Natale with Palmetto Counseling Associates, resident counselor with the S.C. Baptist Convention is on call to pastors and pastor's families. A group of counselors, psychologists and, psychiatrists help people through individual counseling, marriage and family counseling. They address emotional stress, facilitate grieving process over loss, facilitate communication among family members and administer assessments for children and teens. He reminds us to comfort those in need. Some suggestions included "keep focused" when talking with families to get help, don't enable them, talk honestly and infuse this message with the Love of Jesus Christ.
