



Disaster Relief

How things work out is often a "mystery". KBA's mud-out team has one day left to work in McDowell, KY. The White Hat gave us two jobs. The first one is to remove wet insulation and HVAC duck work from under a house. We arrive on the jobsite; it is a nice mobile home 24' x 46'. We start the work. The homeowner is interacting with our team members and becoming comfortable with them. At noon, the homeowner expresses concern for Neddie, her neighbor's wellbeing. It just so happens, that a chaplain team of two are having lunch in their truck right in front of Neddie's house. The house suffered from the flooding. Our team leader asked the chaplain team to call on Neddie and assess the situation. They heard her flood story. She was born with birth leg defects. As a result, she is confined to a hospital bed or wheelchair. During the flood she was in her bed. As the water level in the house rose to the top of her mattress, they became desperate to try something, they forced open the back door. In further desperation, they forced open the front door, which was being forced closed by the current. By the grace of God, the front door was opened. The water level began to recede as the water flowed through the house and out the back door. The two SCDR volunteers shared the gospel with Neddie and her caregiver. Neddie shared that she was a believer having accepted Jesus as Lord. With tears in her eyes, the caregiver accepted Jesus as her Lord and Savior. The angels in heaven rejoiced! Had the White Hat known that removal of the insulation and HVAC duck work would have taken our team more than a day to complete, he would not have given us the job. His goal was to finish up some jobs left incomplete by departing teams. The eternal work to be done that day was to deliver salvation to the caregiver, through a concerned neighbor and God's South Carolina people serving their neighbors in Kentucky.
