Some of the residents that we have helped so far has been senior citizens that has lost everything in house fires. Here is a list of things that they have asked our help with. Toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, washcloths, towels, Kleenex, soap, shampoo/conditioner, shaving cream, razors, combs, ChapStick, feminine hygiene products, lotion, hand sanitizer, baby wipes, toilet paper, dish soap, laundry detergent, disinfectant wipes, gloves, scarves, socks, blankets, tarps, ponchos, toboggans, canned fruit/vegetables, breakfast bars, pasta, soups, individually wrapped crackers, water and Gatorade. We will be collecting these items throughout the year. It will be an ongoing support for them. If you would like to help donate something, you can drop it off at the KBA Missions Center and we will get it to the Social Worker. Please be in prayer for all our seniors in the community and be praying about how you can help!

To picking him up, spinning him around in circles, and to us getting tired and sitting in a chair and just resting together.
